Synod Sentences for Second Sunday in Advent (Populus Zion)

The Lord Comes on the Last Day

The day on which our Lord returns will be a “*great and awesome day*” (Mal. 4:5). For He will come in a cloud with great power and glory. To the wicked and the proud, it will be a Day of judgment that will “*set them ablaze*” (Mal. 4:1). The signs preceding this Day will bring them fear and fainting. But to those who believe, who fear the name of the Lord, this Day is one to look forward to and rejoice in: “. . . *straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near*” (Luke 21:28). Christ our Redeemer is coming; the Sun of Righteousness will bring healing in His wings. Let us, then, give attention to the words of the Lord, which do not pass away. Let us “*through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures*” (Rom. 15:4) be strengthened in our hope by the Holy Spirit and watch diligently for Jesus' coming. Then, by God's grace, we shall escape all these things that will come to pass and stand before the Son of Man.

The Second Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as **Populus Zion**, which are the first Latin words of the Historic Introit assigned to this Sunday. *Populus Zion* means “People of Zion” (*Populus Zion, ecce Dominus veniet ad salvandas gentes* = “People of Zion, behold the Lord shall come to save the nations”).

Upon entering the nave, silence should be observed in order to allow all to prayerfully prepare for the presence of the LORD and the reception of His gifts.



As we celebrate the Sacrament, we also give public confession of our unity in the Christian faith (1 Cor. 10). Members in good standing of congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and congregations in which the LCMS is in Altar/Pulpit fellowship are asked to announce themselves to the pastor prior to the service. All others are invited to speak with the pastor regarding preparation for communion fellowship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church. Those who are baptized but not receiving communion are invited to come forward for a blessing, kneeling with arms crossed at your heart.

Please be assured that we do so not out of spiritual arrogance, but rather in a sincere desire to be faithful to our Lord's command and the apostles' teaching. 





Liturgical Notes from Rev. Will Weedon on Today's Hymn of the Day

As we noted that "Wake, Awake" captured the liturgical tone for the Last Sunday of the Church Year, so Wesley's incomparable "Lo, He Comes" does the same for this Sunday. The antiphon to the Introit captures the joy of the day: Say to the daughter of Zion, "Behold, your salvation comes." What the Church eagerly waits for in the Parousia [Second Coming, ed.] is not "doomsday" but "the regeneration" – the rebirth of creation. When "the Lord causes His majestic voice to be heard" then His people will have "gladness of heart." Everywhere the joy of the early Church's "maranatha!" rings through in this day's celebration.
