

Synod Sentences for the Purification of Mary and the Presentation of Our Lord God Gives the Gift of a Child to Destroy Death

The Lord opened the barren womb of Hannah and gave her the gift of the son for whom she prayed, and in grateful response she presented and gave the child, Samuel, to the Lord's service. "As long as he lives, he is lent to the LORD" (1 Sam. 2:28). So, too, did Mary and Joseph present the Child promised from the fall, born of a virgin's womb. The true offering wasn't the turtledoves or young


pigeons. It was the Child they carried. This Child has come to "destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery" (Heb. 2:14b-15). Set free by His advent in our flesh and the promise of what He would do "in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people" (Heb. 2:17b), Simeon and Anna rejoiced, and we with them, for we know that we, too, can face death unafraid and "depart in peace" (Luke 2:29) when our time comes.

PRAYER UPON ENTERING CHURCH Lord Jesus, You fulfilled the Law perfectly, in every way, for me so that You could be the spotless Lamb of God, the perfect sacrifice for my sins and the sins of all. Holy Gospel Luke 2:22–40

P The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the second chapter.



²²When the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, [Mary and Joseph] brought [Jesus] up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³(as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") ²⁴and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons." ²⁵Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. ²⁷And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, ²⁸he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said,

²⁹"Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word;

³⁰ for my eyes have seen your salvation

³¹that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples,

³²a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel."

³³And his father and his mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed ³⁵(and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed."

³⁶And there was a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived with her husband seven years from when she was a virgin, ³⁷and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She did not depart from the temple, worshiping with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸And coming up at that very hour she began to give thanks to God and to speak of him to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.

³⁹And when they had performed everything according to the Law of the Lord, they returned into Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰And the child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom. And the favor of God was upon him.



If you look at Leviticus 12, you'll see that the sacrifice for purification is either a lamb or this pair of birds if the family had no means to buy a lamb. - hear our prayer. Amen.


Service of the Sacrament



As we celebrate the Sacrament, we also give public confession of our unity in the Christian faith (1 Cor. 10). Members in good standing of congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and congregations in which the LCMS is in Altar/Pulpit fellowship are asked to announce themselves to the pastor prior to the service. All others are invited to speak with the pastor regarding preparation for communion fellowship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church. Those who are baptized but not receiving communion are invited to come forward for a blessing, kneeling with arms crossed at your heart

Please be assured that we do so not out of spiritual arrogance, but rather in a sincere desire to be faithful to our Lord's command and the apostles' teaching. Transitioning to Lent: The joyous 12 Days of Christmas have ended. The visit of the Magi has passed. The Baptism of Christ has been celebrated. Miracles and now the Transfiguration have been commemorated. As we come down from this festive mountaintop and prepare for the long sober road of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, it is good to have a brief period of transition. The next three Sundays have been called "pre-Lent", but their Latin names actually point us to Easter joy – seventy days away, sixty days away, fifty days away. And the three Gospel lessons of these Sundays remind us of the three Solas of the Lutheran Reformation:

Grace Alone - Matthew 20:1-16 (February 9)
Faith Alone - Luke 8:4-15 (February 16)
Scripture Alone - Luke 18:31-43 (February 23)



Today, we turn to <u>The Christian Year of Grace</u> for answers to questions about the <u>Purification of Mary and the Presentation of Our Lord</u>.

Introduction

Even as a helpless babe, Jesus was our Savior, who came to fulfill the Law in our place. Through His blood shed on the cross, we are purified from our sin so we can have eternal life.

<u>Devotional Reading</u>

16. What does the Law say about purification?

It is written in Leviticus 2 [:2–5] that if a woman bears a male child, she shall remain at home six weeks until she is purified. She shall touch no holy thing, and shall not come to the sanctuary; but if she bears a female child, she shall remain at home twelve weeks.

17. What do we find in this Law?

Two things that seem to us almost unfitting: First, a new mother was regarded as unclean even though marriage is God's work and the infant that is born is God's pleasing creation. Second, she was to offer five shekels in silver for a lamb, a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons, in exchange for the firstborn. But setting aside the Jews for a moment, it used to be held in the church that new mothers were not members of the church, but were cut off at that time and in the power of the devil. This led to the abominable superstition of sprinkling water and salt, burning candles and incense, and making many signs of the cross on doors and windows so that Satan would not be able to gain entrance. . . .

24. Why did God give this commandment to the Jews?

For three reasons: first, that they might be mindful of how He struck down all the firstborn in their exodus from Egypt, both men and animals. Second, that the priests and Levites might have their living from it, since they had no inheritance in the land. Third, that he might remind us of the true Firstborn, our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the firstborn of all, in whose blood we are cleansed and sanctified.

25. Did this law apply to Christ, too?

No, Christ is Lord of every law. He served us with it, that He might satisfy the Law. As St. Paul says, Christ was not subject to the Law; thus Christ stood in our place and fulfilled the Law on our behalf (Gal. 4 [:4-5]).

26. Has the Law been abolished, then?

With respect to justification the Law has been abolished. This is why St. Paul says, "You are not under the Law but under grace" [Rom. 6:14], so that by grace and through the merits of Christ you have forgiveness of sins, righteousness, and blessedness. But as far as the obedience of faith is concerned, we are required to do what is becoming of Christians and children of God.
