

Synod Sentences for Quinquagesima



The seeing are blind, while the one who is blind can see (St. <u>Luke 18.31–43</u>.). Jesus tells the twelve that He is going up to Jerusalem to suffer and die and rise again, but they cannot understand or grasp what He is saying. The meaning of His words is hidden from their sight. However, as Jesus makes His way up to Jerusalem, a blind man calls out to Him for mercy. This blind man sees that Jesus is the Messiah, the


Savior, for he calls Him "Son of David." Indeed, Jesus is the Lord's anointed, the keeper of sheep (1 Samuel 16.1–13) who goes to lay down His life for the sheep. He is the incarnate love of the Father who suffers long and is kind, who is not puffed up, who never fails us (1 Corinthians 13.1–13). Jesus opens the eyes of the blind (Isaiah 35.3–7) to see Him not according to outward appearances of lowliness, but according to His heart of mercy and compassion. Those who behold Him thus by faith follow Him to the cross through death into life.




Nicene Creed



As we celebrate the Sacrament, we also give public confession of our unity in the Christian faith (1 Cor. 10). Members in good standing of congregations of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and congregations in which the LCMS is in Altar/Pulpit fellowship are asked to announce themselves to the pastor prior to the service. All others are invited to speak with the pastor regarding preparation for communion fellowship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church. Those who are baptized but not receiving communion are invited to come forward for a blessing, kneeling with arms crossed at your heart.

Please be assured that we do so not out of spiritual arrogance, but rather in a sincere desire to be faithful to our Lord's command and the apostles' teaching. We do this as we live in His love, not only in our home or church, but in the world, where it is often more difficult to love others. We are empowered by the love that Jesus showed us in His sacrificial death on the cross so that we would have life. Now we are blessed to live in His love, bearing much fruit for His sake. May this prayer service help us take time to reflect on His love for us, our love for Him, and how the fruit we bear is a result of living in His love.

You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. (John 15:16).

The Importance of Preparation

Lent is at our door. Are we ready? Ready for the change that God demands of us – change that should have been our program all along? Since Transfiguration Sunday, I have been consciously reminding my people, and myself, at every opportunity, that the Gesima-tide is our time to prepare for and map out the journey that we are going to undergo in following Christ in the way of the cross.

With Quinquagesima, there is the stark reminder that the journey is upon us: "Behold, we are going up to Jerusalem," and the things that are written about the Son of Man are about to come to pass. I have done what I observed at Redeemer, Fort Wayne, back in seminary days – ended the service with the singing of "Jesus, I will ponder now, on Thy holy passion." The Quinquagesima mass brings us to the threshold of that door, like Frodo and the Fellowship of the Ring setting out on the road to Mordor.

It would be insane to undertake such a journey without planning and preparation. Schmemann in *Great Lent: Journey to Pascha* writes about the five (!) Sundays of Lenten preparation in the Orthodox tradition.

To take Lent seriously means then that we will consider it first of all on the deepest possible level—as a spiritual challenge which requires a response, a decision, a plan, a continuous effort. It is for this reason, as we know, that the weeks of preparation for Lent were established by the Church. This is the time for the response, for the decision and the planning.

It saddens me greatly that most of Lutheranism today has embraced a church year that abandoned the idea of preparation—the -gesima Sundays—for three more Sundays of Epiphany, which is hard for me to see as anything other than a capitulation to a kind of liturgical theology of glory. But that is not my main point here, but merely to remind you, gentle reader, and most of all myself, that the season we are about to enter into is one which we must, in Schmemann's words, take seriously. It is not merely a time to follow certain customs, such as fasting, or attend church more frequently, but to ask, seek, and knock for a "real impact on our existence." To understand that in a Lutheran way, I would argue, would be to understand more deeply the price of our justification—the death of the Son of God—and to be drawn ever more closely into union, communion with Christ, that the Spirit would lead and guide us in holy living according to the Word of God.
