**This Joyful Eastertide!**

Easter is not a single day, it is a **season!** It is a great feast that lasts seven weeks! This Sunday, **Jubilate**, we make a joyful noise (**Jubilate!**) over the new life we have received in the Risen Christ. Even though we have a "little while" where we do not see Him, the Spirit He gives at the coming Pentecost sustains us in the joy of the Resurrection.


### **Your Church Offerings**

### **A Stewardship Thought for the Sunday**

1 Peter 2:11 – *"Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul."* Passions of the flesh means the things our flesh desires. One way to sum up all the "passions of the flesh" is to call them greed – the desire to have more things to bring us comfort and peace of mind. But that shows us the real problem with greed. Greed wages war against our soul, and it urges us to place our trust in the things of this world and not in God. But St. Peter reminds us we are sojourners and exiles. We belong to the Kingdom of God. We have been purchased by the blood of Christ and belong to Him. That knowledge frees us from greed, and it frees us for generosity.

### **Synod Sentences for *Jubilate* - *Those Who Wait on the Lord Shall Rejoice***



The people of God are pilgrims and sojourners in this world, looking ahead to a destination yet to come (1 Peter 2:11–20). Though we are now children of God, the fullness of what we shall be has not yet been revealed (1 John 3:1–3). We are those who wait on the Lord. *“The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him”* (Lam. 3:25). Jesus tells us that the wait is just a little while. *“A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me”* (John 16:16). Though

you must experience sorrow for a time, though you must live as strangers in a world that is at enmity with Christ, yet your sorrow will be turned to joy when He returns. *“But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength”* (Is. 40:31). The little while of weeping shall be replaced with an eternity of rejoicing in the presence of Christ the crucified and risen Savior. *“And no one will take your joy from you”* (John 16:22).

### **A Life Thought from Lutherans For Life**



The joy that comes from the risen Christ cannot be taken away (John 16:22). This is not a feel-good happiness dependent upon circumstances. It is a fruit of Christ's Spirit, the joy of our salvation in Christ that circumstances cannot change or diminish. Many of the life issues we deal with today are “joy robbers” and present opportunities to share the joy of the resurrection. *Gracious Savior, fill my words with the comfort and hope of resurrection to everlasting life with You. Amen*
