

1 Corinthians 10:6–13




Holy Gospel

Turn in the account of your management, for you can no longer be manager.' ³And the manager said to himself, 'What shall I do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. ⁴I have decided what to do, so that when I am removed from management, people may receive me into their houses.' ⁵So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he said to the first, 'How much do you owe my master?' ⁶He said, 'A hundred measures of oil.' He said to him, 'Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty.' ⁷Then he said to another, 'And how much do you owe?' He said, 'A hundred measures of wheat.' Response to petitions is, 'hear our prayer ".


- Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

For Christ is the one son of light who is the most zealous, the most single-minded. He gives out the possessions of His Father with wanton abandon, not in wastefulness, but for your benefit. For these can't be wasted. They never run out. And so He lavishes the grace and mercy of God upon you without price, without charging you a cent, without keeping any books, without demanding any accounting of you. Christ takes all that belongs to the Father and gives it to you in abundance. And the treasures He gives never run out, never

fade away, but are stored where moth and rust cannot destroy. They are eternal. They never end.




A Life Thought from Lutherans For Life

Temptations to idolatry exist today as they did in biblical times. The great idol "Death" draws many to its altar. They look to death for rescue from a crisis pregnancy or chronic disease or pain. Death's allure is so great it even tempts Christians to bow before it. But we have a way out of such temptations to faithlessness: "God is faithful" (1 Corinthians 10:1-13). Christ our "Rock" never leaves us (10:4). We can trust in Him. *Rock of our salvation, may Your faithful service to us through Your cross and resurrection move us to be faithful to You.* Amen.

From Martin Luther's Sermon for The Ninth Sunday after Trinity Luke 16:1-9

But true faith, of which we speak, cannot be manufactured by our own thoughts, for it is solely a work of God in us, without any assistance on our part. As Paul says to the Romans, 5:15, it is God's gift and grace, obtained by one man, Christ. Therefore, faith is something very powerful, active, restless,

effective, which at once renews a person and again regenerates him, and leads him altogether into a new manner and character of life, so that it is impossible not to do good without ceasing. For just as natural as it is for the tree to produce fruit, so natural is it for faith to produce good works. And just as it is quite unnecessary to command the tree to bear fruit, so there is no command given to the believer, as Paul says, nor is urging necessary for him to do good, for he does it of himself, freely and unconstrained; just as he of himself without command sleeps, eats, drinks, puts on his clothes, hears, speaks, goes and comes. Whoever has not this faith talks but vainly about faith and works, and does not himself know what he says or whither it tends. For he has not received it; he juggles with lies and applies the Scriptures where they speak of faith and works to his own dreams and false thoughts, which is purely a human work. Whereas



the Scriptures attribute both faith and good works not to ourselves, but to God alone.

He also said to the disciples, "There was a certain rich man who had a steward, and this one was accused to him as squandering his possessions. And calling him he said to him, 'What is this I hear concerning you? Surrender the account of your management, for you are not able still to manage.' And the steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, because my lord is taking away the management from me? I do not have the strength to dig; I am ashamed to beg. I know what I will do, with the result that when I am dismissed from my management, they may receive me into their homes.' And calling to himself each and every one of the debtors of his lord, he said to the first, 'How much do you owe my lord?'

"And he said, 'One hundred baths of olive oil.'

"And he said to him, 'Take your bill and sitting down, quickly write fifty.'

"Then to another he said, 'How much do you owe?'

"And he said, 'One hundred kors of wheat.'

"He says to him, 'Take your bill and write eighty.'

"And the lord praised the steward of unrighteousness because he had acted prudently; because the sons of this present age are more prudent in their own generation than the sons of light.

"I also say to you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous mammon, with the result that, when it fails utterly, they may receive you into the eternal tents.

"The one who is faithful in very little is also faithful much, and the one who is unrighteous in a very little is also unrighteous in much." If, therefore, you have not become faithful in unrighteous mammon, who will entrust you with the true thing? And if you have not become faithful in that belonging to another, who will give to you what is yours?

"No domestic servant is able to serve two lords; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be attached to one and despise the other. You are not able to serve God and mammon."
