
#### The Words of Our Lord

# Synod Sentences for The Seventeenth Sunday after Trinity WHOEVER HUMBLES HIMSELF WILL BE EXALTED

"Do not exalt yourself in the presence of the king" (Prov 25:6-14). Rather, take the lowest



position at the table. Humble yourself before Him. For your place is not for you to take but for Him to give. Conduct yourself with all lowliness and gentleness, bearing with one another in love (Ephesians 4:1-6), that the King may give you glory in the presence of those at the table with you. "For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted" (Luke 14:1-11). Is this not the way of Christ? He is the one who took the lowest place, who humbled Himself even to the point of death for us. He is now exalted to the

highest place at the right hand of the Father that penitent believers may be exalted together with Him in the resurrection. To the humble at His Supper He says, "Friend, go up higher," giving you His very body and blood for your forgiveness that you may ascend to take part in the great wedding feast which has no end.

### **Prayer for the Week**

Lord God, heavenly Father: We beseech You so to guide and direct us by Your Holy Spirit that we may not exalt ourselves, but humbly fear You, with our whole hearts hear and keep Your Word, and keep the day of rest holy, that we also may be sanctified by Your Word; help us, first, to place our hope and confidence in Your Son, Jesus Christ, who alone is our righteousness and Redeemer, and, then, so to amend and better our lives in accordance with Your Word, that we may avoid all offenses and finally obtain eternal salvation; through Your grace in Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one true God, now and forever. Amen.



## A Stewardship Thought for Trinity XVII

Luke 14:11 – "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted." The Kingdom of God is always upside down and backwards like this. We must die in order to live. We must be humbled so we can be exalted. It's like this with giving as well. When we give away, then we receive much more than we bargained for: peace of mind, contentment, and joy.

# An Excerpt from Martin Luther's Sermon for Trinity XVII Luke 14:1-11

This Gospel offers us two leading thoughts; one is general and is found in all our Gospel lessons, the other is peculiar to this one. First, in its general character, it shows who the Lord Jesus is and what we may expect of Him, and in this is exhibited both faith and love. Faith is here set forth in that this man, sick with the dropsy, looks to Christ and firmly believes He will help him. This faith he had as the result of his previous acquaintance with Jesus. He knows Him as a kind, friendly and sympathetic man who always helps everyone and lets none go away uncomforted. Had he not heard such reports about the Lord he would not have followed Him, even into the house. He must indeed have had some Gospel knowledge and believed the wonderful things spoken about Him. And this is the Gospel, as I said, that must be preached and heard before there can be faith. We must know that God is kindly disposed toward us and has sent His Son from heaven to help us. This the conscience must hear and believe; for if God were unfriendly and unmerciful toward us, it would avail little to know that all His creatures sympathize with us. If God is satisfied with us, no creature can do us any harm, as St. Paul says in Rom. 8:31: "If God is for us, who is against us?" Let death, devil, hell and all creation rage; we are safe. Therefore it is the Gospel that must present to us the God-man as merciful. This is the fountain from which our heart can draw faith and a friendly confidence toward God – that He will help both the dying and the living in every distress

## "My Heart's Delight, My Crown Most Bright, O Christ, My Joy Forever!"

The HYMN OF THE DAY, "Seek Where Ye May to Find a Way" (LSB 557) is by George Weissel (1590-1635), a pastor in Königsberg, Prussia. His wonderful hymn describes the Gospel of Christ as the only way for our salvation. The Pharisees looked for their righteousness in the observance of the Law (in this case, the Sabbath), while Jesus fulfilled the law of love on our behalf to heal us. They hymn is full of great dogmatic assertions, such as "His Word is sure, / His works endure," and "We're justified / Because He died." The entire hymn is didactic, that is, it teaches and applies dogmatic truths to our souls. Who is this Jesus? "The God-man and none other." He is the One Who serves us as our King, and His goal is to lead us all to heaven.
