





Response to petitions is "Lord, have mercy."

- P** In peace, let us pray to the Lord:

- P In praise of the awesome works of our God — chiefly the resurrection of Jesus Christ; and for those in error's darkness, that through the light of God's honor and great power He would lead them to submit themselves to Christ's gracious redemption, let us pray to the Lord:
- P For the Church, that God would preserve her from every sorrow and mockery of the enemy; that in this little while between Christ's resurrection and our own, the threats of persecution, loss or discomfort would not turn us from the joy and confidence of His redemption; and that He would sustain all preachers faithful to their calling, all confessors steadfast in their trials and all Christians firm in the faith for life, let us pray to the Lord:
- P For all Christian homes, that by good deeds the ignorance of foolish people may be put to silence before God's divine institution; for all married couples, that God would preserve them in love and faithfulness; for all parents, that God would strengthen them as teachers of the faith; and for the unmarried, that God would uphold them honorable and unashamed in their station, let us pray to the Lord:
- P For every human institution, that according to God's will, they would exercise the authority He gives from above to punish those who do evil and praise those who do good; for good government at every level, under which we may honor everyone, love the brotherhood and fear God; and for us, that our subjection would be offered always for Christ's sake as sojourners and exiles in this world, and that any suffering we must endure would be unjust and borne mindful of Him, let us pray to the Lord:
- P In supplication and intercession for every need, *especially Charlotte, Charles, Cynthia, the Conrad's, Dalton, David, Debra, Faith, Gloria, James, Jamesetta, Jod, Johnathan, Karen, Lucy, Lynette, Marion and her family, Rodgers, Stephen, Susan, Susie* asking for everything now in the name of Jesus Christ, our Mediator, until that day when we will at last ask for nothing, let us pray to the Lord:
- P For all who commune, that here in the Sacrament of the Altar God would give us joy in the midst of sorrow; that coming in repentance, a firm faith and a united confession, we may have honest fellowship in the blessings of Christ's testament; and that with consciences thus cleansed from evil and renewed in Him, we would stand undaunted until the day of visitation, let us pray to the Lord:
- P Lord God, of Your fatherly goodness You allow Your children to come under Your chastening rod to conform us to Your only begotten Son here in suffering on earth and hereafter in glory. Synod Sentences for the Fourth Sunday of Easter
Those Who Wait on the Lord Shall Rejoice

The people of God are pilgrims and sojourners in this world, looking ahead to a destination yet to come (1 Peter 2:11–20). Though we are now children of God, the fullness of what we shall be has not yet been revealed (1 John 3:1–3). We are those who wait on the Lord. “*The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him*” (Lam. 3:25). Jesus tells us that the wait is just a little while. “*A little while, and you will see me no longer; and again a little while, and you will see me*” (John 16:16). Though you must experience sorrow for a time, though you must live as strangers in a world that is at enmity with Christ, yet your sorrow will be turned to joy when He returns. “*But they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength*” (Is. 40:31). The little while of weeping shall be replaced with an eternity of rejoicing in the presence of Christ the crucified and risen Savior. “*And no one will take your joy from you*” (John 16:22).

Stewardship Thoughts for the Fourth Sunday of Easter

1 John 3:2 – “Beloved, we are God’s children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is.”

The essence of our sanctification is becoming like our Lord. As St. John notes, this will only be completed in the Resurrection. In the meantime, we strive toward that goal because we want to walk in the footsteps of our Lord. By His grace we share His destiny in eternal life, and therefore we desire to share His life of service now.

Lutherans For Life Thoughts for the Third Sunday of Easter

The joy that comes from the risen Christ cannot be taken away (John 16:22). This is not a feel-good happiness dependent upon circumstances. It is a fruit of Christ’s Spirit, the joy of our salvation in Christ that circumstances cannot change or diminish. Many of the life issues we deal with today are “joy robbers” and present opportunities to share the joy of the resurrection.

Prayer: *Gracious Savior, fill my words with the comfort and hope of resurrection to everlasting life with You. Amen.*

A Prayer for the Week

Lord God, heavenly Father, of Your fatherly goodness You allow Your children to come under Your chastening rod here on earth, that we might be like Your only-begotten Son in suffering and hereafter in glory: We beseech You, comfort us by Your Holy Spirit in all temptations and afflictions, that we may not fall into despair, but that we may continually trust in Your Son’s promise, that our trials will endure but a little while, and will then be followed by eternal joy; that we thus, in patient hope, may overcome all evil, and at last obtain eternal salvation; through the same, Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one true God, now and forever. Amen.

An Excerpt from Luther’s Writings

“‘A little while,’ He says, ‘and ye behold Me no more,’ for I shall be taken prisoner and they shall deliver Me to death. But it will not last long, and during this short time ye shall be sorrowful, but only remain steadfast in Me and follow Me. It will soon have an end. Three days I will be in the grave; then the world will rejoice as though it had gained a victory, but ye shall be sorrowful and shall weep and lament. ‘And again a little while, and ye shall see Me; and, because I go to the Father.’ That is, on the third day I will rise again; then ye shall rejoice and your joy no man shall take from you, and this will not be a joy of only three days, like the joy of the world, but an eternal joy. Thus the Evangelist John most beautifully expresses the death and resurrection of Christ in these words,

when Christ says, 'A little while, and ye behold Me not; and again a little while, and ye shall see Me; and, because I go to the Father.'" *From Martin Luther's Sermon in the Church Postil for Jubilate Sunday*

A Snippet From 1517

"We share in this joy! We share in it now, amidst all this sorrow. Christ cannot be taken from me! I am His. He answers for me, and all is forgiven. Suffering itself binds us together. We suffer with Him in order that we will be glorified with Him. We win a glorious victory through Him who has loved us. The suffering, the tribulation, and the cross kill my old selfish Adam. It binds me together with my Savior. "So we do not lose heart," Paul writes, "Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day" (2 Cor. 4:16). The outer self wastes away, and the inner self is being renewed when we take up the duties we would shirk or bear with viciousness and chagrin, and when we suffer sickness, aches, and ailments though they continue year after year, and when we continue in faith—with Christ, by Him, keeping ourselves near Him in His word and communion. The apostle writes, "We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame" (Rom. 5:3–5). We have this hope in Christ. And we can say, "I know in whom I believe."
