Stay Home when Sick



This particular Sunday is also known traditionally as EXAUDI SUNDAY, so called because of the traditional Introit, taken from Psalm 17:1. The two first words in Latin are 'Exaudi Domine' — 'Hear, Lord'. It is said to be the saddest Sunday of the church year, because the disciples were at a loose end after Jesus ascended to Heaven. They missed Him and were unsure as to what the arrival of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost would mean.


I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

and the life + of the world to come. Amen.







Synod Sentences for the Seventh Sunday of Easter The Spirit of Truth Bears Witness to Jesus

The Spirit of Truth bears witness to Jesus, who is the truth. But the world does not receive the truth. It loves its own and hates those who are of the truth. Just as Jesus was scorned, so is His Church. "The hour is coming when whoever kills you will think he is offering service to God" (John 16:2). Yet it is by Jesus' suffering and death that we are saved. Therefore we rejoice to share in His sufferings, that we may also share in His resurrection glory (1 Pet. 4:7–14). Through the ministry of the Spirit of Truth, we are cleansed from the deceit

of our idols and given a new heart and a new spirit, the heart and Spirit of Christ (Ezek. 36:22–28). He now works in us fervent, self-giving love for one another, love which covers a multitude of sins, "that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ. To him belong glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen" (1 Pet. 4:11).

Stewardship Thoughts for the Seventh Sunday of Easter

1 Peter 4:10 – "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." The grace, the gifts, the blessings – they are all from God. We are to use them as stewards, not as owners. That means we should seek to use them in the way the Owner wants them used. So, we listen to His Word, pray for His Wisdom, and receive His grace.

Lutherans For Life Thoughts for the Seventh Sunday of Easter

The loving Creator's presence and power surmounts every impediment to life and sanctifies all its impairments. He works new life in those as dead as stones (Ezekiel 36:26), abundant life among those as abandoned as exiles (Ezekiel 36:24, 28), and everlasting life for those as bereft as beggars (Ezekiel 36:29-30). Jesus stoops these gifts into – and brings them up out of – every kind of uncleanness (Ezekiel 36:25).

Prayer: Dear Father, invite and involve us in Your overcoming. Amen.

An Excerpt from Luther's Writings

"Beloved, you have heretofore heard much about faith. Today you hear also of the witness of faith and of the cross that follows. Paul says to the Romans, "With the heart man believeth unto righteousness." Rom. 10:10. If one be pious, he must begin in his heart and believe. That serves only unto godliness; it is not enough for salvation. Therefore, one must also do what the Christian life requires, and continually abide in that life. Hence, Paul adds, "If thou shalt confess with thy mouth Jesus as Lord, thou shalt be saved," It is these two things that constitute our salvation, faith and the confession of faith. Faith rescues from sin, Hell, Satan, death and all misfortunes. Now, when we have this we have enough. We then let God live here that we may reach a hand to our neighbor and help him. Besides, God desires to have His Name praised and His Kingdom developed and extended. Therefore, we must praise His Name, confess our faith and win others to do the same, so that God's Kingdom may be extended and His Name praised." From Martin Luther's Sermon in the Church Postil for Exaudi Sunday, 1522.

A Prayer For the Week

Lord God, heavenly Father, we give thanks to You, that through Your Holy Spirit You have appointed us to bear witness of Your dear Son, our Lord Jesus Christ: We beseech You, inasmuch as the world cannot endure such testimony and persecutes us in every way, grant us courage and comfort, that we may not be

offended because of the cross, but continue steadfastly in Your testimony, and be always found among those who know You and Your Son, until we obtain eternal salvation through the same, Your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one true God, now and forever. Amen.

A Snippet From 1517

Resurrection is victory. God shall arise! Christ has risen! However, this is not the sum of the LORD's provision for the people.

The Psalm appointed for this seventh Sunday of Easter is <u>Psalm 68:1-10</u>. <u>Psalm 68</u> is an excellent Psalm for the Easter season. It begins with a description of the Resurrection as a great victory! The enemies are conquered (sin, death and Satan—on the run!) and the righteous ones rejoice—they are provided for in this great victory. Resurrection is victory. God shall arise! Christ has risen!

However, this is not the sum of the LORD's provision for the people. Beginning at verse 5 the language of the LORD God is as Father of the fatherless and protector of the widows, and then the One who frees the prisoners and settles the lonely/solitary. This is the language the prophets of old use to describe the Messianic Age. The lame shall walk, the blind shall, the widows and orphans shall be cared for, the prisoners released, etc. The Messiah shall come for those who are outcasts and neglected by society. Why is this so important?

First, it describes who we are as sinners: Separated from God, helpless to care for ourselves, hopeless in our efforts to access the LORD God. Thus, Messiah comes to us where we are at and He brings relief, healing, forgiveness and salvation. Second, these identifying marks of the Messiah become the marks of the Church. The Church takes care of the outcasts as they live and walk in the faith. The Church follows the admonition to "love your neighbor" because it is their identity in Christ Jesus.

Messiah comes to us where we are at and He brings relief, healing, forgiveness and salvation.

So, the Psalm reading ends with the language of provision: The LORD provides. He takes care of the needy in both body and soul and the Church is the instrument of His hand. Verses 7 and following use the Exodus as proof, a reminder of how the LORD has provided in the past to bring assurance to the people that He will be faithful and provide in the future; even to the point of sending His Son to die and rise for the people. *Jeffrey Pulse 2020*
