
Stay Home when Sick


and see it. Please have me excused.' 19 And another said, 'I have

Proclamation of Christ


- As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

Synod Sentences for Second Sunday After Trinity The Gospel Call Goes Out to All

Wisdom has issued an invitation to the divine feast: "Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed. Leave your simple ways, and live, and walk in the way of insight" (Prov. 9:5–6). This is the call of the Spirit of Christ to believe the Gospel and to receive His saving gifts in the Holy Supper. Many make excuses and reject this invitation, even as the Jews did in the days of Jesus, yet the

Master's house will be filled. The Gospel call therefore goes out to the lowly and despised, into the highways, even to all the Gentiles (Luke 14:15–24). For "you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ" (Eph. 2:13–22). In Christ, believing Jews and Gentiles are no longer strangers but fellow members of the household of God. The enmity of class and race is put to death through the cross. Having been reconciled in the one Body of Christ, we are enabled to love one another (1 John 3:13–18) as we await the marriage feast of the Lamb in His kingdom which will have no end.

Stewardship Thoughts for the First Sunday After Trinity

Luke 14:19 – "And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I go to examine them. Please have me excused.' " The things of this world tempt us to cast aside the things of God. The things of this world demand our attention, time, finances, etc. But Jesus invites us to the feast – what could be more important than this gracious invitation? Today's parable invites us to examine our own priorities and attempted excuses and then to come home to the Lord in humble repentance.

Lutherans For Life Thoughts for the First Sunday After

Our Savior and our Scriptures do not recognize a functional distinction between physical deficiency and spiritual deficiency. All human beings suffer from a fallen sinfulness that makes us decisively compromised (Luke 14:21-23). And Christ's sacrifice, victory, and companionship call and escort every such one into His heavenly household!

Prayer: God of compassion and mercy, gather together Your precious ones so that we embrace both You and each other. Amen.

An Excerpt from Luther's Writings

"This invitation, however, took place thus, as the text says: The Lord sent out his servant to invite the guests to this costly supper, that is, the Apostles were all sent forth with one and the same word into all the world, to bid and call to this supper with one voice and with one Gospel, or with one message. Thus, when St. Peter arrived at and preached in a place where St. Paul had preached before, it was the same teaching which the one preached as the other, and the hearers also could say: Behold, he preaches just like we heard before from the first one; they agree and are one and the same. In order to show this unity, the Evangelist says: 'And he sent forth his servant,' and says not, his servants, as if he spake of many servants. But the message, the servant should execute and with which he should gain recruits, was: 'Come; for all things are now ready.'" From Martin Luther's Sermon in the Church Postil for the Second Sunday after Trinity Sunday, 1523.
