

A Note From the Organist:

Georg Phillip Telemann was possibly the most prolific composer of all time. He is credited with thousands of works, including 1400 church cantatas. (Bach is believed to have written about 400, of which about 200 are extant.) However, he only wrote a handful of pieces for organ and keyboard. "Lord Jesus Christ, be Present Now" was frequently sung as a sermon hymn in the early Lutheran Church. Telemann gives us four brief settings.

Paul Manz served many years at Mount Olive Lutheran Church in Chicago. A master of improvisation, he single-handedly invented the hymn festival. Most of his published organ music originated as improvisations, later revised for publication. This setting for the full organ concludes with a pedal solo including the powerful 32' Bombarde.





Holy Gospel John 4:46–54

P The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the fourth chapter.

who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets.





Prayer of the Church

Synod Sentences for the Twenty-first Sunday After Trinity God Declares Us Righteous Unsheathing His Word Against All Evil

"Let there be light,' and there was light" (Gen. 1:1–2:3). The Father speaks, and it is so. His Word accomplishes what it says. He created all things out of nothing through His Son by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Father's creative Word became flesh in Jesus Christ, that He might restore fallen creation and save fallen man. To the nobleman whose son was deathly ill, Jesus says, "Go; your son will live" (John 4:46–54). And in the very hour Jesus spoke, the nobleman's son was made well. The Word of Christ still accomplishes what it says. In baptism, absolution, and the Lord's Supper, He declares His life–giving forgiveness to you, and it is so. This saving Word of God is the sword of the Spirit by which you are able to fight off all the onslaughts of the devil (Eph. 6:10–17). "Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm."

Lutherans For Life Thoughts for the Twenty-first Sunday After Trinity

The picture of the armor-clad Christian in Ephesians 6:10-20 is one of defense not offense. We are not fighting to obtain truth. We have the truth. We fight to defend the truth upon which we stand. Be encouraged in this spiritual battle that can seem so frustrating at times. "[B]e strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might" (6:10).

Prayer: Thank You for Your truth, Lord, and Your armor. Help us stand firm. Amen.

A Prayer For The Week

Almighty and everlasting God, by Your Son You have promised us the forgiveness of sins, righteousness, and everlasting life: We beseech You, by Your Holy Spirit so enliven our hearts that in daily prayer we may seek our help in Christ against all temptations, and, constantly believing His promise, obtain that for which we pray, and at last be saved; through Your Son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one true God, now and forever. Amen.

An Excerpt from Luther's Writings

"Our Gospel lesson speaks further of the increase of faith, and here there is a difference. Although faith fully possesses Christ and all His riches, yet it must nevertheless be continually kept in motion and exercised, so that it may have assurance, and firmly retain its treasures. There is a difference between having a thing and firmly keeping hold of it, between a strong and a weak faith. Such a great treasure should be firmly seized and well-guarded, so that it may not be easily lost or taken from us. I may have it indeed in its entirety, although I hold it only in a paper sack, but it is not so well preserved as if I had it locked in an iron chest. From the Church Postil for the Twenty-First Sunday after Trinity Sunday.

A Snippet From 1517

"...To see how Christ is at work in this text it is important to recognize Paul is calling the baptized to be on the defensive against Satan's attacks, not the offensive. It is not ours to conquer Satan. Christ has accomplished this already for us on the cross. The victory is His, thus it is ours. So, when we stand firm in this armor, it is not we who have clothed ourselves to rush the battlefield in the hope we might win on the last day. The Holy Spirit puts no spears, darts, or offensive weapons in our hands with which to storm Satan's kingdom (even the sword of the Spirit spoken of in 6:17 is referring to the Word which defends us against the lies of Satan). Rather, it is that we belong to the Victor who has clothed us in His armor to protect us while the enemy rages on. Thus, to be "strong in the Lord" is to be "in the strength of HIS might" (6:10).

There is a great deal of discussion among scholars on where Paul is drawing this armor and battle imagery from. But, perhaps the most intriguing explanation for our purposes is how Paul's imagery echoes Isaiah's prophecy of YHWH fighting and winning the battle for His people:

"He saw that there was no man and wondered that there was no one to intercede; then His own arm brought Him salvation, and His righteousness upheld Him. He put on righteousness as a breastplate, and a helmet of salvation on His head; He put on garments of vengeance for clothing and wrapped Himself in zeal as a cloak" (Isaiah 59:16-17).

It is Christ, then, the incarnate God who puts on His armor and wins the battle for us. Thus victorious, He puts His armor on us to protect us from the attacks of Satan. "Paul... is alluding to the classical belief that a champion's armor brought strength and victory to those who wore it. But he goes farther, for this is not just the armor of an ordinary human champion." To put on this armor is to be clothed in the battle gear of the victorious, incarnate God. "In striking Gospel irony, these enemies who are not made of blood and flesh are defeated by the flesh and blood of the divine Man Jesus Christ, crucified and risen to unite all people to Himself."

When preaching this text, there are two dangers to avoid. First, do not suggest Christ's victory renders the battle obsolete. Satan really is attacking, and your parishioners deal with it every day. It can actually be a great comfort to know it is normal for the Christian to face attacks. It is not a sign of weak faith, but quite the opposite!

At the same time, do not make Satan seem so powerful that he sounds like an equal power to God. He is a defeated loser, not a divine being. The key is to recognize, though he may be stronger than us, He is not stronger than Christ. And your hearers belong to Christ, who will not let them go. What is more, the Devil's work is all counterproductive. The more he rages at the Christian, the more the Christian flees to Christ in prayer (6:18). So, stand firm against the attacks of the evil one, knowing his days are numbered. Christ has crushed the serpent's head (Genesis 3:16). The victory is ours in Jesus! Sing Easter hymns of victory!" Bob Hiller, 2021
