

A Note From the Organist:

John Ferguson is professor emeritus at St. Olaf College in Minnesota. He is still much in demand as a recitalist and clinician, and has many published works to his credit. His setting of "Behold Host" features an ethereal sound, with the melody played on the pedal with 4-foot stops against soft strings in the manuals.

Richard Heschke was chairman of the organ department at Concordia College in Bronxville, New York, and was best known as a teacher and recitalist. His setting of For All the Saints" is straightforward but effective.
