

A Note From the Organist:

Blind from birth, Helmut Walcha nevertheless became one of the most important organists of the Twentieth Century. He was a master Bach interpreter and recorded nearly all the organ works. He served most of his career at the Dreikönigskirche (Church of the Three Kings) in Frankfurt, where he custom-designed the organ to be ideal for Bach and his contemporaries.

BWV 736 features a flowing triplet rhythm, with melody played in the pedal. At the end, Bach appends a simple setting of the chorale, using a figured bass, a kind of musical shorthand which gives the performer the harmony without having to write out the complete score.

Synod Sentences for the First Sunday in Advent

The Lord Jesus Comes in Humility to Redeem Us

The new Church Year begins by focusing on the humble coming of our Lord. "*Behold, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey*" (Matt. 21:5). Even as He was born in a lowly manger, so Jesus rides into Jerusalem on a beast of burden. For He bears the sin of the world. He is the Son of David riding to His enthronement on the cross, where He shows Himself to be "*The LORD is our Righteousness*" (Jer. 23:5-6). Our Lord still comes in great humility to deliver His righteousness to us in the Word and Sacraments. Before receiving Christ's body and blood, we also sing, "*Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!*" (Matt. 21:9) And as we receive the Sacrament, we set our hearts on His return in glory, for "*our salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed*" (Rom. 13:11).

Lutheran For Life Thoughts for the First Sunday in Advent

"The Lord is our righteousness" (Jeremiah 23:6b). What comforting truth for hearts troubled with sin's guilt that keeps resurfacing. Sometimes a past sin can be so haunting that we do not always feel forgiven, or we cannot forgive ourselves. The sin of abortion is a prime example. But our righteousness does not depend upon us or our feelings. Our righteousness is Christ! *Prayer: O Lord our Righteousness, may my comfort and hope be anchored in You and not my feelings. Amen.*

An Excerpt from Martin Luther's Sermons

"This Gospel encourages and demands faith, or it pre-figures Christ coming with grace, and none may receive or accept save he who believes Him to be the Man, and has the mind, as this Gospel portrays in Christ. Nothing but the mercy, tenderness and kindness of Christ are here shown, and he who so receives and believes on Him is saved....He come[s]...sitting upon an ass....He indicates by this that He comes not to frighten man, nor to drive or crush him, but to help and to carry his burden for him....it also shows the pomp and conduct of the disciples towards Christ...also that of the multitude...They manifested no fear nor terror, but only blessed confidence in Him...." *From the Church Postil for Ad te levavi, 1521.*
