



## A Note From the Organist:

Carson Cooman is a very prolific composer in many forms. His works include symphonics and operas as well as church music. He lists this Sarabande (2015) as opus1127. "In modum benedictionem" means "in the manner of a blessing."

After serving several London churches John Travers was appointed to the Chapel Royal in 1737. His voluntary is typical of the English style of the time, with a slow introduction followed by a movement on a solo stop. English organs in the 18th Century didn't have pedals, so composers developed a lighter style than their European counterparts.





#### **Water from the Rock**

#### **Laborers in the Vineyard**

<sup>1</sup>[Jesus said:] "The kingdom of heaven is like a master of a house who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. <sup>2</sup>After agreeing with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. <sup>3</sup>And going out about the third hour he saw others standing idle in the marketplace, <sup>4</sup>and to them he said, 'You go into the vineyard too, and whatever is right I will give you.' <sup>5</sup>So they went. Going out again about the sixth hour and the ninth hour, he did the same. <sup>6</sup>And about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing. And he said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' <sup>7</sup>They said to him, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You go into the vineyard too.' <sup>8</sup>And when evening came,

the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Call the laborers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last, up to the first.' <sup>9</sup>And when those hired about the eleventh hour came, each of them received a denarius. <sup>10</sup>Now when those hired first came, they thought they would receive more, but each of them also received a denarius. <sup>11</sup>And on receiving it they grumbled at the master of the house, <sup>12</sup>saying, 'These last worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the day and the scorching heat.' <sup>13</sup>But he replied to one of them, 'Friend, I am doing you no wrong. Did you not agree with me for a denarius? <sup>14</sup>Take what belongs to you and go. I choose to give to this last worker as I give to you. <sup>15</sup>Am I not allowed to do what I choose with what belongs to me? Or do you begrudge my generosity?' <sup>16</sup>So the last will be first, and the first last."

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.



# Synod Sentences for Septuagesima Sunday Grace Alone

The people of Israel contended with the Lord in the wilderness (Ex. 17:1–7). They were dissatisfied with His provision. In the same way, the first laborers in the vineyard complained against the landowner for the wage he provided them (Matt. 20:1–16). They charged him with being unfair, but in reality he was being generous. For the Lord does not wish to deal with us on the basis of what we deserve but on the basis of His abounding grace in Christ. The first—those who rely on their own merits—will be last. "For they were overthrown in the wilderness" (1 Cor. 10:5). But the last, those who rely on Christ, will be first. For Christ is the Rock (1 Cor. 9:24–10:5). He is the One who was struck and from whose side blood and water flowed that we may be cleansed of our sin.

## <u>Lutherans For Life Quote for Transfiguration Sunday</u>

God our Father can draw water from rock (Exodus 17:6), reward the unworthy (Matthew 20:9), and make the last first (Matthew 20:16). Surely He will overhaul our hopeless

circumstances and lost causes, even when human pains and mistakes have brought them about (1 Corinthians 10:1-5). Indeed, we not only witness it but participate in it as well (Exodus 17:5). Keeper of our souls, work faith in us and those we serve to await great transformation at Your hand. Amen.

### A Snippet From 1517

Certainly, the people of Israel are being stubborn, unfaithful and untrusting but one may wonder if this issue is a deeper one. Are they afraid?

The Old Testament Lesson for this Sunday is written in the second book of the Torah, Exodus. The text is the account of the water that comes from the rock to quench the thirst of the Israelite people. This is a familiar account, but it contains several interesting nuances to be examined. Contextually, the people have crossed the Red Sea on dry land and the waters have swallowed down the Egyptians. They have been saved by the LORD from their enemies in this miraculous event. Immediately, the people come to some bitter waters and they complain-grumble and murmur-against Moses, who throws a piece of wood into the waters and makes them sweet. Then the people grumble and complain against Moses and Aaron because they are hungry for bread and the LORD sends them the bread from Heaven-manna-which lasts for forty years! Now, they are grumbling and quarreling with Moses because they are thirsty, and they are just arriving at Mount Horeb/Sinai. There is an obvious pattern emerging. This time the LORD instructs Moses to strike the rock with his staff so water will gush forth for the people, and it happens. Certainly, the people of Israel are being stubborn, unfaithful and untrusting but one may wonder if this issue is a deeper one. Are they afraid? The last verse of this pericope names the place as Massah and Meribah, because of the grumbling of the people of Israel, and because they tested the LORD by saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?" This last phrase could be telling us how the Israelites are afraid the LORD may not be with them and they want proof of His presence. It may not so much be they are thirsty, rather that they cannot see, or do not recognize the presence of the LORD as they journey into this strange and dangerous wilderness. They are afraid and so they "act out."

It is also important to take note of the New Testament reference of this rock in Paul's first letter to the Corinthians. In <u>I Corinthians 10:14</u> we hear of how the people of Israel were all baptized in the Red Sea and they ate of the same spiritual food (manna) and drank the same spiritual drink—they drank from the spiritual Rock which followed them through the wilderness journey... and the text identifies this Rock as Christ. This NT reference is made in the context of a warning against idolatry, because even though the people experienced all these amazing events together, many still fell prey to idolatry.
