

A Note From the Organist:

Helmut Walcha was best known as a performer and expert on Bach and early music, but composed a number of chorale preludes on Lutheran hymns, a few of them better known in Europe. "Hear Us Father, when we Pray" is based on LSB 773, and presents the melody in a highly ornamented form.

"Christ Has Arisen, Alleluia" is a Tanzanian melody, and is new to LSB. (466) So far, there is a limited number of organ settings. Jacob Weber has helped that situation with his very dramatic treatment of the tune.


Nicene Creed
