
Proper response is "Lord, have mercy."


Proclamation of Christ

Synod Sentences for the Fourth Sunday After Trinity Christ's Mercy Is Ours to Show to Others

"Be merciful, even as your Father also is merciful" (Luke 6:36–42). The old Adam in us wants to condemn and seek vengeance. But the Lord says, "Vengeance is Mine, I will repay" (Rom. 12:14–21). To condemn, to avenge yourself, is to put yourself in the place of God. It is to fail to trust that He is just. Ultimately, it is to disbelieve that Jesus suffered the full vengeance for all wrongs. Only Christ is merciful as the Father is merciful. He is the one who overcame all evil with the good of His cross, forgiving even His executioners. Jesus is our Joseph, who comforts us with words of pardon and reconciliation (Gen. 50:15–21). He is the One who does not condemn but gives life that runs over. Only through faith in Christ are we sons of the Father—being merciful, forgiving, doing good to our enemies. For in Christ we know that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us (Rom. 8:8–13).

A Prayer For The Week

O Lord God, heavenly Father: You are merciful, and through Christ promised us that You will neither judge nor condemn us, but graciously forgive us all our sins, and abundantly provide for all our wants of body and soul: We pray that by Your Holy Spirit You would establish in our hearts a confident faith in Your mercy, and teach us also to be merciful to our neighbor, that we may not judge or condemn others, but willingly forgive all, and, judging only ourselves, lead blessed lives in Your fear; through Your dear Son Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one true God, now and forever. Amen.

An Excerpt from Martin Luther's Sermons

"Therefore, observe here what a perversion it is for man to exercise himself in doing works to God, which should be done to his neighbor; and then centers his faith in men and saints, which he should center alone in God. Turn this around, and then it is right, thus: faith must belong alone to God, whoever receives the divine works, God alone does them, and the same works of God we receive alone through faith. Then we should apply ourselves to our neighbor and arrange all our affairs to the end that they serve our neighbor. Before God all should be done in pure faith alone. The reason of this is because no one can help us but God, and what we have in body and soul we have alone from God, and in Him alone should we anchor our heart." From Martin Luther's sermon for the Fourth Sunday after Trinity, 1523.

Children's Devotional for the Fourth Sunday After Trinity

What is the meaning of this Gospel lesson? Read Luke 6:36-42

We are to be merciful and forgive others. Do not judge or condemn others. What Jesus is condemning here, in this Gospel, is a double standard. You can't hold others to a higher standard than you hold yourself to. And the standard by which you are held to are not some petty rules, but rather God's holy Law — Law that does not bend, Law that does not allow for loopholes, Law by which all stand condemned; God's holy Law which you break time and time again. And neither is it your job to stand as judge, jury and executioner over your neighbor. That is God's place. Your job, when it comes to your neighbor, is to defend him, speak well of him, and explain everything in the kindest way (SC. I: 8) — whether it's your family, your friends, or even and especially your enemies.

A Quote From Lutheran's For Life

Whether it be the evils of abortion or the assaults on biblical marriage, it becomes easier to attack people rather than confront the evil. We end up fighting evil with evil. But the way of Christ is different. "Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them" (Romans 12:14). "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good" (12:21). Jesus, help us boldly confront evil and compassionately deal with those caught up in it. Amen.
