

M Note From The Organist:

Richard Proulx was Music Director at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago for many years. He composed a great deal of organ and choral music, and served as an editor for a number of hymnals. His Partita is a set of variations on today's opening hymn. The tune is by Henry Purcell (1659-1695) who was organist of Westminster Abbey, as well as a prominent composer of music for the theater.

Pavid Cherwien is Music Director at The Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd in Minneapolis. He has partially inherited the legacy of Paul Manz, in that he presents many hymn festivals. He gives us a very energetic setting, flourishes in the manuals and the melody in the pedal, including extensive use of double pedal.

Synod Sentences for the Sixth Sunday After Trinity Our Only Hope Is in Christ's Righteousness

"Unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matt 5:20). God demands nothing less than perfection and holiness from you in regard to His commandments (Ex. 20:1–17). Your only hope, then, is not in your own goodness but in the goodness of Christ, who did not come to destroy the Law and the Prophets, but to fulfill them for you. In Christ, your righteousness does indeed exceed that of the scribes and Pharisees. For you have been baptized into

Christ's death and your sinful nature crucified. Therefore, he who has died has been freed from sin (Rom. 6:1–11). You are now raised with Christ to walk in newness of life and to share in His resurrection on the Last Day. Christ has brought you through the baptismal sea "out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery" (Ex. 20:2). Therefore, "consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:11).

An Excerpt from Martin Luther's Sermons

"In this Gospel, the Lord takes in hand the office of extolling and explaining the law of Moses, for it would not have been becoming for Him to have insisted in an unfriendly manner to make the people pious. He is not a lawgiver, but a Savior, Who never takes aught from anyone, but always gives. So He also in this instance proves His kindness in explaining the law and gently instructing; as there is need and want, He does not sternly insist, as did Moses, who without much ado wished that people were either pious or dead. For this reason, Christ's action on this occasion is to be considered one of great benefit to us, in that He teaches us where we fail and come short. Here He particularly treats of the failings due to wrath, which causes so much havoc among men, as is seen on every side, yea, nearly the whole world is under its sway." From the Church Postil for the Sixth Sunday after Trinity Sunday, 1523.
