

## 1 Note From The Organist:

George Oldroyd was a highly respected church musician, serving a number of churches in England during his lifetime. His many Anglican Mass settings are still in common use. The Liturgical Prelude No. 1 is from a set of three written in 1948. The subtle is "My soul hath a desire and longing to enter the courts of the Lord." It is written without a time signature, giving it a chantlike quality. It exploits the rich colors of the English cathedral organ.

Walther left relatively few free organ works, although he transcribed a number of concertos by Italian composers. The Prelude and Fugue in P minor is an example of what is known as the "stylus fantasticus," derived from Buxtehude.



I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.




## **Prayer of the Church**


The proper response is "Lord, have mercy."


- P In peace, let us pray to the Lord:








### **Proper Preface**
