### "Savior of the Nations Come"

Stanza 1 is a call for the virgin's Son to come and make his home among and for all creation, heaven and earth, to marvel that the Lord of all "chose such a birth. He took on human flesh and became one of us except without sin.

Stanza 2 proclaims that the Word of God, Christ the Lord, who was "in the beginning" (John 1:1) became flesh like us, not through human agency but "by the Spirit of our God."

<sup>1</sup>The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.







### **Collect of the Day**




### **Collect for Peace**
