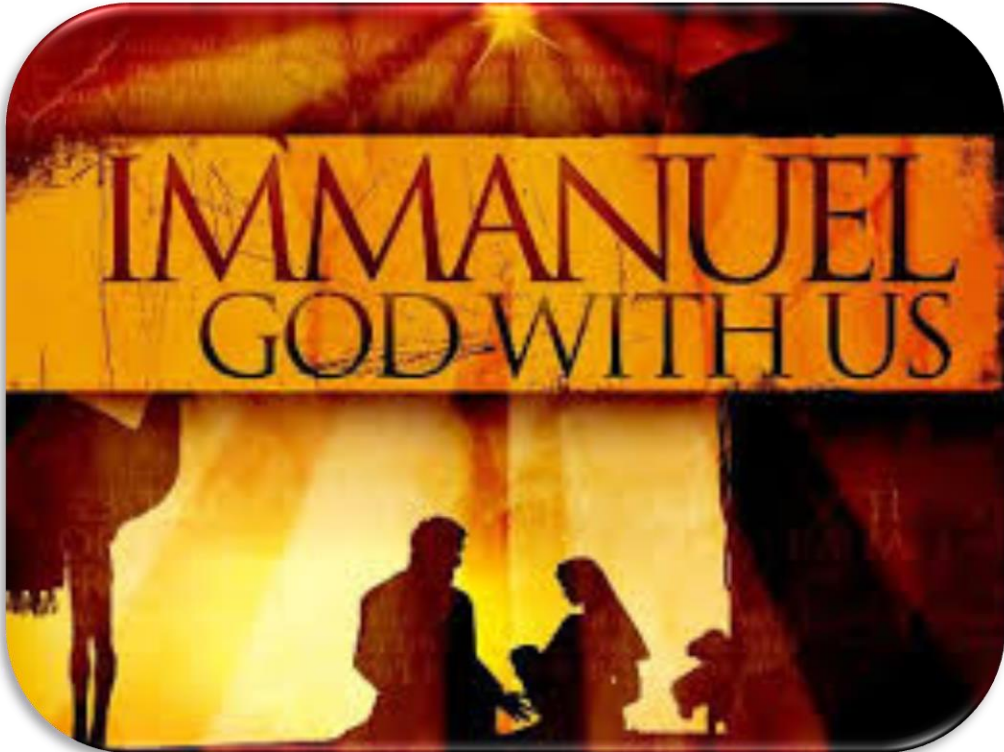

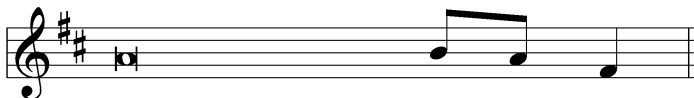
Savior of the Nations, Come

Stanza 7 uses the image of light that now shines from the manger into the night, the light of Christ, which shatters the darkness, and the light in which faith now abides.

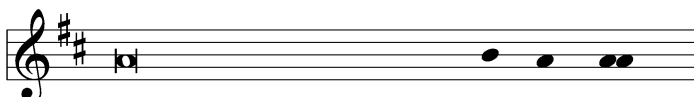

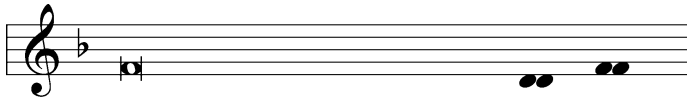


