

## A Note From The Organist:

Kevin Hildebrand is Kantor at Concordia Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. He has many publications to his credit and is well-known as a teacher and clinician. He gives us here a gentle setting of the hymn tune Twenty-Fourth, (LSB 841, 845).

J. G. Walther was Bach's cousin and they often collaborated with each other in recital. Walther was an early musicologist and much of what we know about the music of the Seventeenth and Eighteenth Centuries (particularly in Germany) is due to his writings and collection of scores. He wrote many compositions on chorales, often presenting multiple verses.

### **Jesus Foretells His Death and Resurrection**

<sup>21</sup>From that time Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. <sup>22</sup>And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, "Far be it from you, Lord! This shall never happen to you." <sup>23</sup>But he turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a hindrance to me. For you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man."

### **Take Up Your Cross and Follow Jesus**

<sup>24</sup>Then Jesus told his disciples, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. <sup>25</sup>For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. <sup>26</sup>For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his life? #### **Nicene Creed**


I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.



**P** Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.




hear our prayer.

### <u>Lectionary Summary for the Fourteenth Sunday After Pentecost</u>

After St. Peter confessed that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God, our Lord "began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things from the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised" (Matt. 16:21). Upon hearing this "theology of the cross," Simon Peter stumbled into a satanic "theology of glory." But the glory of God is revealed in the Passion and cross of His incarnate Son. The faithful prophets, such as Jeremiah, suffered persecution and rejection in anticipation of Jesus' cross. Yet the Lord did not abandon them; He remembered them, and He was with them to deliver them (Jer. 15:15–20). By His cross, Jesus has redeemed the world, and in His resurrection, He has vindicated all who trust in Him. Thus, the Christian life is a discipleship of self-sacrificing love. Since Christ Jesus has reconciled us to God, we "live peaceably with all" (Rom. 12:18). By the certainty of His cross and resurrection, we "rejoice in hope," and we are "patient in tribulation" and "constant in prayer" (Rom. 12:12).
