



<u>A Note From The Organist:</u>

Karl Osterland is organist at Historie Trinity Lutheran Church in Detroit, where he has access to a wonderful organ by C. M. Skinner, one of the greatest American organ builders of the early Twentieth Century. I had the privilege of meeting him at the recent ALCM convention. "If you But Trust in God to Guide You" is from a recently published collection, which he wrote during the height of the Covid crisis, trying to find ways ti comfort and inspire his congregation. The phrases of the chorale are alternated with a melody played on a solo reed stop.

BWV 615 is from the Little Organ Book. It is a very festive setting, featuring an ostinato pattern in the pedals. Near the end, the Cymbelstern is added. This is a set of small bells on a frame which was rotated by the wind of the organ. The organ in Weimar for which Bach wrote this piece had this device.





God's Good Purposes

¹⁵When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, "It may be that Joseph will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." ¹⁶So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died, ¹⁷'Say to Joseph, Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their

Do Not Pass Judgment on One Another

¹As for the one who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not to quarrel over opinions. ²One person believes he may eat anything, while the weak person eats only vegetables. ³Let not the one who eats despise the one who abstains, and let not the one who abstains pass judgment on the one who eats, for God has welcomed him. ⁴Who are you to pass judgment on the servant of another? It is before his own master that he stands or falls. And he will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make him stand.

⁵One person esteems one day as better than another, while another esteems all days alike. Each one should be fully convinced in his own mind. ⁶The one who

observes the day, observes it in honor of the Lord. The one who eats, eats in honor of the Lord, since he gives thanks to God, while the one who abstains, abstains in honor of the Lord and gives thanks to God. ⁷For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. ⁸If we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. ⁹For to this end Christ died and lived again, that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.

¹⁰Why do you pass judgment on your brother? Or you, why do you despise your brother? For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God; ¹¹for it is written,

"As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God."





Holy Gospel

The Parable of the Unforgiving Servant

²¹Peter came up and said to [Jesus], "Lord, how often will my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?" ²²Jesus said to him, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven.

²³"Therefore the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who wished to settle accounts with his servants. ²⁴When he began to settle, one was brought to him who owed him ten thousand talents. ²⁵And since he could not pay, his master ordered him to be sold, with his wife and children and all that he had, and payment to be made. ²⁶So the servant fell on his knees, imploring him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything." ²⁷And out of pity for him, the master of that servant released him and forgave him the debt. ²⁸But when that same servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii, and seizing him, he began to choke him, saying, 'Pay what you owe.' ²⁹So his fellow servant fell down and pleaded with him, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.' ³⁰He refused and went and put him in prison until he should pay the debt. ³¹When his fellow servants saw what had taken place, they were greatly distressed, and they went and reported to their master all that had taken place. ³²Then his master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me. ³³And should not you have had mercy on your fellow servant, as I had mercy on you?' ³⁴And in anger his master delivered him to the jailers, until he should pay all his debt. ³⁵So also my heavenly Father will do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your brother from your heart."

who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets.





■ Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.




in our midst and throughout the world. Prepare Your baptized children to be faithful confessors of the hope that is in them. Lord, in Your mercy,


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


Post-Communion Collect

Lectionary Summary for the Sixteenth Sunday After Pentecost Forgiving as the Lord Forgives Us

In settling His accounts with us, our Lord acts not with anger, but with compassion. He does not imprison us as we deserve, but He forgives all our debts and releases us (Matt. 18:23–27). Therefore, our Lord bids each of us to have "mercy on your fellow servant" and "forgive your brother from your heart" (Matt. 18:33, 35). By the Lord's forgiveness of our sins, we are free to forgive those who sin against us, because He has been handed over to the jailers in our stead and He has paid our entire debt with His lifeblood. Whether we live or die, we "are the Lord's" (Rom. 14:8). Since we all will "stand before the judgment seat of God," we are not to despise our brother (Rom. 14:10), but gladly forgive him. By the grace of God, our brother also "will be upheld, for the Lord is able to make him stand" (Rom. 14:4). Though we daily sin against each other, the Lord intends "to bring it about that many

people should be kept alive" (Gen. 50:20). Jesus speaks kindly by His Gospel and promises: "I will provide for you and your little ones" (Gen. 50:21).

Memory Verse Challenge

1 Samuel 12:24 Only fear the Lord and serve him faithfully with all your heart. For consider what great things he has done for you.

A Snippet From 1517

Gospel: Matthew 18:21-35

In this parable, notice how Jesus invites us to consider that forgiveness is something more than a moment. It is a way of grace that extends throughout an entire kingdom.

...We often call this parable, "The unforgiving servant." The problem, however, is not just that the servant is unforgiving. The problem is the servant is clueless. When he received forgiveness from his master, he entered a different kingdom. It is a place where sins are forgiven. When he went out into the world, however, he refused to live in that kingdom. For him, forgiveness was a single transaction before his master, not a life-changing experience. It was something that could be set aside, not something through which he always lived.

Unfortunately, we can fall into the same problem. Sometimes we limit forgiveness to a personal experience of God's grace in one moment in time. We are baptized, receive absolution, partake of the Lord's Supper, but that forgiveness is seen only as a moment; something you experience in church. It is not seen as something you live through as you enter into your Savior's world. Forgiveness changes your world. When God forgives you on account of Christ, he brings you into a kingdom that reaches to the ends of the earth and lasts to the end of time.

Forgiveness is not just a momentary experience, a get-out-of-jail-free card that gives us the opportunity to go out and work harder to accomplish our salvation. No, forgiveness is a life-changing event. It changes who we are. Suddenly, we discover we are not servants managing our money but children of God who live in His Kingdom where grace never ends. Sure, we can go back to the kingdom where you pay your debts... but who would ever want to do that?

Our world's conversation about sin can be frustrating. It can bring you to your knees in confession or solidarity. It can sap you of strength or overwhelm you with activity. But if you listen only to this conversation, you are missing out on something God is doing – forgiving sins. God has forgiven your sins in Christ and now He calls you, frees you, and sends you to forgive the sins of others.
