

A Note From The Organist:

John Behnke's setting of My Hope is Built on Nothing Less features a highly ornamented version of the melody, played on the Cornet, a combination of 5 flute ranks with a penetrating sound, a combination which was developed very early in the organ's history. The original melody is then stated on a solo reed, after which the original ornamentation returns.

Wilbur Held's setting of "Abbot's Leigh" is among his last works, published in 2011. It features his usual sense of color, using the principal choruses and reeds, with a contrasting middle section using strings.
