

A Note From The Organist:

Paul D. Weber is Professor Emeritus at Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, NC. He is widely published and has contributed settings to LSB and other hymnals. The early American hymn tune "Restoration" has a melody based on a pentatonic scale, often associated with Asian music, but also found in many folk songs. Playing only on the black keys of a keyboard will produce a pentatonic scale, a feature which Weber exploits in the first 31 measures of this piece, which is played entirely on the black keys.

Paul Manz's setting of "Built On a Rock" features rapid figuration in the manuals, with the melody in the pedal. In the final measures the 32' Violone is added, producing a very powerful deep bass for the conclusion.





If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness, under the law blameless. ⁷But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. The Parable of the Tenants

³³[Jesus said:] "Hear another parable. There was a master of a house who planted a vineyard and put a fence around it and dug a winepress in it and built a tower and leased it to tenants, and went into another country. ³⁴When the season for fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to get his fruit. ³⁵And the tenants took his servants and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. ³⁶Again he sent other servants, more than the first. And they did the same to them. ³⁷Finally he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' ³⁸But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and have his inheritance.' ³⁹And they took him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. ⁴⁰When therefore the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" ⁴¹They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death and let out the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the fruits in their seasons."

"The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is marvelous in our eyes'?

⁴³Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people producing its fruits. ⁴⁴And the one who falls on this stone will be broken to pieces; and when it falls on anyone, it will crush him."

⁴⁵When the chief priests and the Pharisees heard his parables, they perceived that he was speaking about them. ⁴⁶And although they were seeking to arrest him, they feared the crowds, because they held him to be a prophet.

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.




Proper response is "Hear our prayer".


- C hear our prayer.










Proper Preface

The Words of Our Lord

Lectionary Summary for the Nineteenth Sunday After Pentecost The True Vine Redeems the Vineyard of the Lord of Hosts

"The vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the house of Israel" (Is. 5:7), which He planted "on a very fertile hill" (Is. 5:1). He did everything for His vineyard, not only clearing it of stones and planting it with "choice vines," but also building the "watchtower" of His prophets and hewing out the "wine vat" of His priesthood in its midst (Is. 5:2). But when "he looked for it to yield grapes," there were only "wild grapes" of bloodshed and unrighteousness (Is. 5:2, 7). The Lord Jesus likewise described the unfaithfulness of those who were called to care for His vineyard (Matt. 21:33-35). But in this He also describes His cross and Passion (Matt. 21:38-39), by which He has redeemed the vineyard for Himself. He is the true Vine, planted by death into the ground, and in His resurrection He brings forth "the fruits in their seasons" (Matt. 21:41). Among those good grapes of the true Vine is the apostle Paul. Once a zealous persecutor of the Church, he "suffered the loss of all things" in order to "gain Christ and be found in him," to "know him and the power of his resurrection" (Phil. 3:8– 10).

A Snippet From 1517

Old Testament: Isaiah 5:1-7 (Pentecost 18: Series A) The LORD is not yet finished with His vineyard.

The Old Testament Lesson for this Sunday is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah. The text is <u>Isaiah 5:1-7</u> and presents an interesting challenge in relation to its location in the book of Isaiah. Biblical scholars have long pondered about why these first five chapters of Isaiah are placed BEFORE the call/sending of the prophet in chapter 6. Basically, the challenge is to address the issue of prophecies, such as the prophecy of our text, coming before the prophet is appointed. How does that work? Apart from the usual higher-critical opinions that some redactor was prowling around the text (the easy way out), there are other possibilities that maintain a high view of the text. My personal preference is Isaiah uses these five chapters to set the stage for the reader/hearer. These chapters let us know, clearly, the climate into which Isaiah is called and why the LORD God uses such strong language when He gives Isaiah his prophesying/preaching orders (job description). Another way to speak of this is to say Isaiah is bringing the people (readers/hearers) into the story. Now, they are part of the drama and recognize the reason for the LORD's instructions to Isaiah as he is called into the prophetic office. The LORD has made His case as He has shown the mess the people of Israel have become.
