A Note From The Organist:

Biographical information on Robert Lind is limited, but he has a number of organ compositions in print from Concordia and others. The hymn tune on which his setting is based was extracted from a piano work by Robert Schumann (1810-1856) and has had a number of texts. By whom or when the hymn adaptation was done seems to be unclear.

Sweelinek wrote a number of toccatas. The word is derived from the Italian "toccare" (to touch) and refers to a keyboard work. Although Sweelinek's are not as virtuosic as later toccatas, they still contain some rapid passage work.





Flee Sexual Immorality

¹²"All things are lawful for me," but not all things are helpful. "All things are lawful for me," but I will not be enslaved by anything. ¹³"Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. ¹⁴And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. ¹⁵Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! ¹⁶Or do you not know that he who

is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, "The two will become one flesh." ¹⁷But he who is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. ¹⁸Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. ¹⁹Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? <u>Lectionary Summary for the Second Sunday After Epiphany</u>

The Lord God Is with You and Reveals Himself to You by the Preaching of His Word
The Lord Jesus calls Philip and Nathanael to "come and see" that He is "the Son of God"
and "the King of Israel" (John 1:43–49). And they shall see even "greater things than these"
(John 1:50). For His body is the temple of God on earth, and by His priestly sacrifice the
heavens will be opened to all who believe and are baptized into Him. Therefore, He calls
Philip and Nathanael, first to hear His Word and then to speak as apostles, even as He
once called Samuel and established him "as a prophet of the Lord" (1 Sam. 3:20). As the
Lord was with Samuel "and let none of his words fall to the ground" (1 Sam. 3:19), He also
accompanies and upholds the preachers of His Word in our day. Thus, by the Gospel that
is preached to you, "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you" (1 Cor. 6:19). Since
your body thus belongs to the Body of Christ, is meant "for the Lord" and shall be raised
up like Him, now "glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:13–20).

Verse for the Week

"For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time." **Timothy 2:5-6**

Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

Life issues like surprise pregnancy and terminal diagnosis come with uncertainty. But the Lord our God knows both our worries (Psalm 139:4) and the best way forward. He has already seen (John 1:48) what it will take to save, and He has still chosen life for all humankind, even when we behold only darkness and despair. We may not know what tomorrow holds, but we know who holds tomorrow.

Writings from Martin Luther

See, then, that you become a member of Christ. This is to be accomplished through faith alone, regardless of works. And having become a member, if God has appointed you a duty according to your capacity, abide in it. Let no one allure you away from it. Esteem not yourself better than others, but serve them, rejoicing in their works and their offices as you do in your own, even if they are less important. Faith renders you equal with others, and others equal with you, and so on. Christian Equality and Christian Gifts Paul's design in this epistle is to teach equality. He would have no one "think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but so to think as to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to each man a measure of faith." Or, to express it differently: "Let each one regard that his work for which he has a gift, and let him perform it. But he is not consequently to esteem himself superior to others differently gifted. He should delight in their works, justly recognizing those works as of God's grace, and knowing that God distributes the measure of faith and this his grace not in one way, but in many ways." Paul's peculiar choice of words here, referring to all gifts as the grace of God and the measure of faith, is meant to teach that no man may regard his individual gift as a peculiar instance in that respect, as do they who are not of the common faith. It is the one same God, Spirit and Lord, the apostle tells us (1 Corinthians 12:5-11), who effects in this work and that, whether small or great, in you or in me, in the one same faith, love and hope. [15] The importance, the nobleness and helpfulness of this doctrine is beyond our power of expression. The wretched condition of all Christendom, divided as it is into innumerable sects, is, alas, plain testimony that no body nor member, no faith nor love, seems longer to exist anywhere. Unity of mind in relation to the various gifts of God cannot exist in connection with human doctrines. Hence it is impossible for the orders and the doctrines of our ecclesiastical lords to stand with unity of mind; one or the other must fall.
