A Note From The Organist:

The hymn tune which forms the basis for Jacob Weber's prelude is known variously as Terra Beata and Terra Patris. It is most closely associated with the text "This is My Father's World." Weber gives it a colorful setting.

Mendelssohn spent much of his career in England, and his six organ sonatas were commissioned by an English publisher. Pedal keyboards were only beginning to appear on English organs, and even experienced players were still getting used to them. Therefore, when Mendelssohn wrote some challenging pedal passages, he arranged the music in such a way that the right hand could play the manuals while the left hand played the pedal part. The opening movement of the First Sonata contains a couple of such passages.

<u>Lectionary Summary for the Third Sunday in Epiphany</u> The Lord Calls Us to Himself by the Preaching of Repentance in His Name

When "the word of the Lord came to Jonah the second time," sending him to preach judgment against the great city of Nineveh, "Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord" (Jonah 3:1, 3). By this preaching, the people were brought to repentance. Because they "believed God," as He spoke to them through His prophet, "they turned from their evil way" and were spared "the disaster that he had said he would do to them" (Jonah 3:5, 10). St. Paul also warns that "the appointed time has grown very short" (1 Cor. 7:29). Therefore, while we live in this world and deal with it, we are not to cling to it, nor put our trust in it, for "the present form of this world is passing away" (1 Cor. 7:31). Rather, give "your undivided devotion to the Lord" (1 Cor. 7:35). When our Lord Jesus Christ comes and is proclaimed in the Gospel, "the time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand" (Mark 1:14–15). Therefore, He still calls men and sends them to become "fishers of men" with the net of that Gospel (Mark 1:17).

Verse for the Week

For thus said the Lord God, the Holy One of Israel, "In returning and rest you shall be saved: in the quietness and in trust shall be your strength." **Isaiah 30:15**

Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

The size of a people (as in the case of Nineveh, Jonah 3:3-4) makes no difference to their worth. Nor does the height of an individual's status (so says the Psalmist, Psalm 62:9) affect his or her sanctity. The life-giving grace of God measures according to His abundance rather than our scarcities of age, appearance, or ability. May we likewise direct gazes beyond abortion's and assisted suicide's shortsightedness (1 Corinthians 7:30-31).

Martin Luther on Discipleship

Christ preaching. Everything proceeds in a simple way. There is a sea, and the Lord Christ preaches from the ship or boat on the sea; the people stand on the shore and listen to him. The people are praised because they listen so cheerfully to the word of God. Whoever has God's word and listens attentively to it has a great advantage.

First, from the word of God one learns to know the will of God, how he is disposed toward us, and what he will do for us in the life to come.

Secondly, We learn from the word how our outward life, position and manner, delineated in the word, and sanctified by the word, is a true ser vice of God, and pleasing in his sight. *Launch out into the deep*. Though God is near to us, and willing to sup ply our wants, yet he will have two things from us; namely, *work* and *hope*; though he delayed a little, yet he here directs Peter to make a draught for fishes; and says: "Launch out into the deep;" as if he would say, Cast in your net, do the works which pertain to a fisherman, and leave the result to me. I will not commit the care, but the work to you...

... They enclosed a great multitude of fishes. Christ confirms the faith of temporal and bodily help, in that he bestows so great a draught of fishes upon Peter. But he observes herein this order and rule, which he himself has given, (Matt. 6:33 L) "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you." According to this Scripture he proceeds and proves the example and experience of it; whereby he also wishes to com fort his church and people, that he will care for them, though they may be everywhere persecuted and driven away. (Ps. 34:11 L; 33:18 L) When they had despaired of human counsel, consolation and power, then he comes with his help. Here let us count up what good things faith brings and accomplishes. For above this, that the believer has God's grace and blessing, he has also the promise that he shall have enough for his necessity, causing him a good, quiet, joyful heart; wherefore faith may indeed be called the root of all goodness. There is no lack in good things, there is a lack only in faith; sooner must the angels come and give. To this we must first come, that we may be able to confide our stomachs to the Lord; yet thereby we also must learn that we can confide our souls to God. The Evangelist teaches this.
