

## M Note From The Organist:

Karl Osterland is Music Director at Historic Trinity Lutheran Church in Detroit. "Christians to the Paschal Victim" is a Gregorian Chant. The text is attributed to Wipo of Burgundy, who died e. 1050. It can be found at LAB 460, where it is paired with "Christ is Arisen" (LSB 459). Only the text is found in the pew edition. The accompaniment edition gives the music complete. The organ setting here is very misterioso, perhaps in quiet anticipation of Easter morning. It uses tone colors that would be typical of those on the E. M. Skinner organ at Trinity, which dates from the 1930s.

Buxtchude's Pracludium is one of his most popular works. It actually consists of a Prelude, Fugue, and Chaconne. It begins with a dramatic pedal solo, then a Fantasia-like prelude. The fugue is very energetic, with some challenging pedal passages. A Chaconne is a piece based on a repeated bass pattern, and Buxtchude provides an insistent pedal to underscore this section. The piece conveys a celebratory mood throughout.










### Salutation and Collect of the Day

#### The Resurrection




### **Prayer of the Church**

The proper response is "Lord, have mercy."


- **P** In peace, let us pray to the Lord:
