

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:






Jesus Walks on the Water

⁴⁵Immediately [Jesus] made his disciples get into the boat and go before him to

the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. 46And after he had taken leave of them, he went up on the mountain to pray. 47And when evening came, the boat was out on the sea, and he was alone on the land. 48 And he saw that they were making headway painfully, for the wind was against them. And about the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. He meant to pass by them, ⁴⁹but when they saw him walking on the sea they thought it was a ghost, and cried out, ⁵⁰ for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid." 51 And he got into the boat with them, and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded, 52 for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were hardened.

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.






- every home, uniting its members in forgiveness and causing Your Son to dwell in every heart through faith. Lord, in Your mercy,

A Note From The Organist:

Ralph Vaughan Williams was probably the most important English composer of the early Twentieth Century. He wrote music in many forms and his symphonics have become standard repertoire for orchestras. He wrote a large number of choral works and Edited The English Hymnal. His output for the organ was small but effective. His most popular organ work is the Three Preludes on Welsh Hymn Tunes, of which "Rhosmedre" is the middle movement. The tung is named after a village in Wales, and can be found at LSB 863, with the text "Our Father by Whose Name." The setting is very pastoral in mood.

Buxtghudg's Choral Prelude takes the form of a fantasy, with the melody moving between the manual and pedal, and a somewhat free rhythm.

Stewardship Bulletin Blurb

Ephesians 3:20 - "Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think ..." We often shortchange God by failing to remember what Paul says here: God can do far more than what we can think or ask. His power, and His love, are without bound and without measure. So why do we fear to follow His Word? Isn't it in fact fear that keeps us back from a life of joyous generosity and open-handedness? But God is able to do everything far more abundantly! So let us not be afraid to take the Lord at His Word and live according to it.

Lectionary Summary for the Tenth Sunday After Pentecost Creation Is Redeemed and Sanctified by the Word of Christ Jesus

Having spared faithful Noah and his family from the flood, the Lord established His covenant with them, "and with every living creature," that never again would there be "a flood to destroy the earth" (Gen. 9:9–11). He signed and sealed this everlasting covenant with His rainbow in the clouds, by which He sees and remembers His promise that "the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh" (Gen. 9:13–16). Although creation suffers under the curse of sin, the Lord preserves and orders creation for the benefit of His Church. In particular, all of creation is redeemed and sanctified by the incarnate Son of God. "Take heart," and "do not be afraid," for He is with you on the sea. He is not a ghost, but He has come in the flesh to save you. He has gotten "into the boat" with you, and the wind that was against you has ceased (Mark 6:45–51). For He is the Word and promise of the Father, and His own flesh and blood are the covenant by which you are "strengthened with power through his Spirit in your inner being" (Eph. 3:16–17).

Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

Fatherhood embodies the gift and the work of God Himself (Ephesians 3:15). In bringing forth life from their very bodies, our Heavenly Father makes men into His instruments and agents. He expects a strong love from them because He has endowed them with His own. Let us encourage them to protect their children even when inconvenient and provide for mothers even if difficult.

"Let's get back to the basics and drown out the ugly message that death is the solution to life issues. God loves life and His creation. He has no desire for any of us to take our own life or the life of someone else. Our days are in His hands, not our own. May your For Life work be blessed, and may you be filled with the joy that comes with doing the Lord's work as a faithful servant."
