






The Words of Our Lord

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<u>A Note From The Organist:</u>

Scott M. Hyslop is Director of Music at Zion Lutheran Church in Frankenmuth, Michigan. His setting of "Let Us Ever Walk With Jesus" is a gentle pastorale, with the melody played by the left hand.

Froberger was a pupil of Frescobaldi, and although there are French and German influences in his music, the Italian style predominates. Italian organs had limited pedal keyboards (usually a pull-down or a single rank that was permanently coupled to the manual) so he rarely indicates pedal use, leaving it up the performer. In the G major Toccata, the pedal is used for a few sustained notes at the beginning and end. The rest is typical of the Italian toccata, with much passage work and a brief fughetta in the middle.

Lectionary Summary for the Twelfth Sunday After Pentecost

The Lord Jesus Feeds Us with His Flesh, in Order to Strengthen Us with His Own Life God the Father sent His Son into the world, so that the world might have life in Him. Now He "draws" you to His Son, Christ Jesus, by the preaching of His Gospel. "Everyone who has heard and learned from the Father" comes to Jesus, who will never cast him out but "will raise him up on the last day" (John 6:44–45). He is "the bread of life," who "comes down from heaven" in the flesh, that you may eat of Him and "live forever" (John 6:48–51). Although "the journey is too great for you," in the strength of this food you shall come to "the mount of God." Do not be afraid, and do not despair, but "arise and eat" (1 Kings 19:5– 8). And "no longer walk as the Gentiles do, in the futility of their minds" (Eph. 4:17), but "walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us" (Eph. 5:2). In Him, you have been "created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness" (Eph. 4:24). Therefore, "be imitators of God, as beloved children" (Eph. 5:1), by "forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you" (Eph. 4:32).

Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

Elijah the prophet once considered his life not worth the living. In love the Lord God did not affirm his autonomy but set about to convince him otherwise (1 Kings 19:4-5). Since Jesus imparts also unto us the relief of entrusting all things to our Almighty Maker (John 6:38), couldn't our sanctity-of-life advocacy extend the same privileges to anxious and endangered neighbors?

<u>Luther's Explanation of Small Catechism: Sacrament of the Altar</u> 372. May those who are weak or struggling in faith come to the Sacrament?

Yes. The words "for you" show us that Christ instituted this Sacrament for weak and struggling sinners like us, to draw us to Himself and to strengthen our faith in Him.

- 1129 **Mark 9:24** Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!"
- 1130 **John 6:37** All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and whoever comes to Me I will never cast out.
- 1131 **Isaiah 42:3** A bruised reed He will not break, and a faintly burning wick He will not quench; He will faithfully bring forth justice.

Note: "Such people must learn that it is the highest art to know that our Sacrament does not depend on our worthiness... on the contrary, we go exactly because we are poor, miserable people. We go exactly because we are unworthy. This is true unless we are talking about someone who desires no grace and Absolution nor intends to change" (LC V 61). (pages 341-342)
