

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:

#### What Defiles a Person

<sup>14</sup>[Jesus] called the people to him again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand: <sup>15</sup>There is nothing outside a person that by going into him can defile him, but the things that come out of a person are what defile him." <sup>17</sup>And when he had entered the house and left the people, his disciples asked him about the parable. <sup>18</sup>And he said to them, "Then are you also without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him,



<sup>19</sup>since it enters not his heart but his stomach, and is expelled?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.) <sup>20</sup>And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. <sup>21</sup>For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, <sup>22</sup>coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. <sup>23</sup>All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."

Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.








#### The Words of Our Lord

P Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My → body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

#### **Proclamation of Christ**

- P As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.







## M Note From The Organist:

Gordon Young was a prolific composer of choral and organ music, with hundreds of publications to his eredit. Most of his music was designed for service use, and is aimed at the average church choir, but is well crafted without excessive technical demands. His prelude on "Slane" begins quietly, builds to full organ and then returns to the quiet opening section.

The Prelude and Fugue in A minor is one of the 8 short Preludes and Fugues once attributed to Bach, but now believed to be by one of his pupils. Some musicologists have speculated that all eight are not necessarily by one person, because there is a wide variety of styles represented in the group. No definitive proof one way or the other has been found to date. Whoever wrote them, they are wonderful short pieces, and most organists study them early in their earger.

# Lectionary Summary for the Fifteenth Sunday After Pentecost We Are Cleansed and Sustained by the Word of God

Wickedness and evil come "from within, out of the heart," and that is what defiles a person (Mark 7:21–23). Hence, we cannot save ourselves, because we are sinful and unclean from the inside out. But as the Lord Jesus "declared all foods clean" (Mark 7:19), so He cleanses us by His Word, the preaching of repentance and the forgiveness of sins. Therefore, "listen to the statutes and the rules" of the Lord, "and do them, that you may live" (Deut. 4:1). For His Word is righteous, and to live according to it is "your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples" (Deut. 4:6). Cling to His Word, and also teach it "to your children and your children's children" (Deut. 4:9). Put on this "armor of God" by hearing and heeding what He speaks to you, that you may "stand firm" in the evil day (Eph. 6:11–13). Gird yourself with the righteousness of Christ, by faith in the "gospel of peace," and take up "the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God," by confessing Christ Jesus and "praying at all times in the Spirit" (Eph. 6:14–18).

#### **Stewardship Bulletin Blurb**

Deuteronomy 4:6 – "Keep them and do them, for that will be your wisdom and your understanding in the sight of the peoples, who, when they hear all these statutes, will say, 'Surely this great nation is a wise and understanding people." There is no wiser, more fulfilling life than a life lived according to the Word of God. We should be encouraged by this when the world tempts us to think that the Word of God is harmful to us. Our Father loves us, so all His Word is meant to bless us. We may have to suffer for upholding the Word of God, as St. John the Baptist did. But the cross the Lord has for us to bear will be far better than any we would create for ourselves.

#### **Lutheran's For Life Thoughts**

The Lord Jesus insists that visible qualities like age, appearance, and ability do not subtract value from life or impart worth to it (Mark 7:18-23). Rather, invisible sinfulness disqualifies us all from both bodily rights and spiritual privileges. But invisible forgiveness—and God's grace in creating, redeeming, and calling—delivers sanctity to every member of our race. May this truth proceed forth from our hearts and out of our lips!

# Explanation of Small Catechism: The Lord's Prayer, The Sixth Petition 282. What do we ask God to do for us when we pray this petition? We pray that

- A. Our faith in and love for Jesus would not grow cold with unbelief;
- 941 **Matthew 24:9-14** Then they will deliver you up to tribulation and put you to death, and you will be hated by all nations for My name's sake. And then many will fall away and betray one another and hate one another. And many false prophets will arise and lead many astray. And because lawlessness will be increased, the love of many will grow cold. But the one who endures to the end will be saved. And this

- gospel of the kingdom will be proclaimed throughout the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come.
- 942 Mark 9:24 Immediately the father of the child cried out and said, "I believe; help my unbelief!"
  - B. We would stay alert and on guard against threats to our faith;
- 1 Corinthians 10:12-13 Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation He will provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.
- 944 **Mark 14:38** Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.
  - C. Our Father would guard us against all sins that come from Satan, the world, and our sinful flesh.
- Galatians 5:19-21 Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.
- 946 **Revelation 3:10** Because you have kept My word about patient endurance, I will keep you from the hour of trial that is coming on the whole world, to try those who dwell on earth.
- 947 **Proverbs 1:10** My son, if sinners entice you, do not consent.

  Read **Genesis 39:1-20**, where Joseph withstood the temptation of Potiphar's wife, and **Hebrew's 6:4-6**. about the danger of falling away from faith.

#### 283. How does God help us to resist those threats?

He provides us with the Word of Christ, the Holy Spirit, Baptism, Absolution, the Lord's Supper, and the gift of prayer as armor and weapons.

- 948 **Romans 13:14** But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.
- 949 **1 Corinthians 10:13**
- 950 **Ephesians 6:11, 17-18** Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil.... And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication.

Read **Matthew 4:1-11**, where Jesus repelled Satan with the Word of God, and **2 Corinthians 4:7-12**, about how God's power can overcome our sins and weaknesses.

Note: "There is no help or comfort except to run here, take hold of the Lord's prayer, and speak to God from the heart like this: 'Dear Father, You have asked me to pray. Don't let me fall because of temptations'" (LC III 110). (pgs. 270-272)
