Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:







#### The Sin of Partiality

<sup>1</sup>My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory. <sup>2</sup>For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in, <sup>3</sup>and if you pay attention to the one who wears the fine clothing and say, "You sit here in a good place," while you say to the poor man, "You stand over there," or, "Sit down at my feet," <sup>4</sup>have you not then made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? <sup>5</sup>Listen, my beloved brothers, has not God chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom, which he has promised to those who love him? <sup>6</sup>But you have dishonored the poor man. Are not the rich the ones who oppress you, and the ones who drag you into court? <sup>7</sup>Are they not the ones who blaspheme the honorable name by which you were called?

<sup>8</sup>If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself," you are doing well. <sup>9</sup>But if you show partiality, you are committing sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors. <sup>10</sup>For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become accountable for all of it...

#### Faith Without Works Is Dead

<sup>14</sup>What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? <sup>15</sup>If a brother or sister is poorly clothed and lacking in daily food, <sup>16</sup>and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled,"

without giving them the things needed for the body, what good is that? <sup>17</sup>So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead.

<sup>18</sup>But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works.

#### Jesus Heals a Deaf Man

<sup>31</sup>[Jesus] returned from the region of Tyre and went through Sidon to the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. <sup>32</sup>And they brought to him a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment, and they begged him to lay his hand on him. <sup>33</sup>And taking him aside from the crowd privately, he put his fingers into his ears, and after spitting touched his tongue. <sup>34</sup>And looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." <sup>35</sup>And his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. <sup>36</sup>And Jesus charged them to tell no one. 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### A Note From The Organist:

"God's Word is our Great Heritage" (LSB 582) is a single verse from a longer hymn by Nikolai Grundvig (1783-1872). It is sometimes sung to the tune of "A Mighty Fortress." The tune used is LSB was written by Friedrich O. Reuter, who was born in Germany, then moved first to Canada and then to Chicago, where he was an important teacher and editor of many publications. Benjamin Culli has done a quiet setting, featuring strings and the Open Diapason.

Georg Muffat was born in France, with a French mother and Scottish father. He later studied in Italy. He is noted for including more performance indications in his scores than was typical of the time. He wrote instrumental and keyboard music, and 3 operas which are lost. The Toccata is  $\mathcal{P}$  Major is somewhat more virtuosic than many pieces of the time, with a large number of 32nd note runs in the final section.

#### Lectionary Summary for the Sixteenth Sunday After Pentecost Our Merciful Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, Does All Things Well

The Lord proclaims the Gospel "to those who have an anxious heart" to comfort and encourage them with His presence. He comes not only with threats of "vengeance" and "recompense," but with His gracious salvation (Is. 35:4). He opens "the eyes of the blind" and "the ears of the deaf," and He loosens "the tongue of the mute" to "sing for joy" (Is. 35:5–6). Like water on thirsty ground, He speaks His life-giving Word to people of all nations. With His Word and the touch of His hand, He does "all things well," so that you may now speak "plainly" (Mark 7:31–37). You confess the truth of God in Christ to the glory of His holy name, and you call upon His name in every trouble, confident that He will hear and answer. As you pray and confess with your tongue, so also "love your neighbor as yourself" (James 2:8). Show your faith "in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Lord of glory," by loving without partiality. For God has "chosen those who are poor in the world to be rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom" (James 2:1–5).

#### **Stewardship Bulletin Blurb**

James 2:2 – "For if a man wearing a gold ring and fine clothing comes into your assembly, and a poor man in shabby clothing also comes in ..." God shows no partiality: rich and poor alike are called into the kingdom. And both rich and poor alike have something to contribute to the kingdom in accordance with the callings God has given them in their lives. This is why both the Old and New Testaments talk about proportional giving – that is, giving a proportion of our income to the Lord's work. This makes it possible for rich and poor alike to have the honor of supporting God's work.

#### Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

Almighty God makes the Prophet Isaiah solemnly proclaim, "Behold, your God will come ... He will come and save" (Isaiah 35:4). Jesus demonstrates its fulfillment when He does not cast aside but cares for the burdened body of a neighbor with impairments (Mark 7:32-35). So why should we hold our tongues any longer when we could be dispensing the same hope to those facing surprise pregnancy or terminal diagnosis?

"Let us never forget and continue to trust in God as our only resource when we face difficult life issues. Continue to pray for our country as some leaders continue to pursue making laws that jeopardize precious lives and challenge God's plan for life. #### Weekly Memory Verse Challenge

**Romans 1:16** For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek.

### Explanation of Small Catechism: The Fifth Commandment

#### 62. How does this commandment apply to some specific issues today?

- A. It forbids aborting the life of an unborn child (also called elective abortion).
- 168 **Jeremiah 1:5** Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born I consecrated you; I appointed you a prophet to the nations.
- 169 **Psalm 139:16** Your eyes saw my unformed substance; in Your book were written, every one of them, the days that were formed for me, when as yet there was none of them.

Read **Luke 1:41-44**, where the unborn baby John leaped for joy, acknowledging the unborn Jesus as Lord.

Note: Human life is God's gift. The living but unborn are persons in the sight of God from the moment of fertilization(conception). Therefore, every human life is precious to Him and is also precious to us. Any destruction of embryos through the use of abortifacient drugs or in connection with procedures such as IVF (in vitro fertilization) is also, therefore, contrary to God's will. In some rare and exceptional cases, a medical procedure that is actually necessary to save a mother's life may tragically and unintentionally result in the death of her unborn child.

- B. It forbids killing oneself (suicide), seeking help in killing oneself, assisting a person in taking his or her own life (assisted suicide), or killing a person who asks to die or whose life is deemed as too burdensome (euthanasia).
- 170 **Psalm 134:14-15** But I trust in You, O LORD; I say, "You are my God." My times are in your hand.

Note: When someone is near death, certain treatments may only prolong suffering and not enable either recovery or physical well-being. In such cases, it is important to note that *allowing death to occur* when someone is irreversibly dying is different from *causing death* (which is forbidden by God).

- C. It forbids acting violently or abusively toward a child or spouse (child abuse or domestic abuse).
- 171 Colossians 3:19 Husbands, love your wives, and do not be harsh with them.
- 172 **Colossians 3:21** Fathers, do not provoke your children, lest they become discouraged.
  - D. It forbids engaging in reckless and self-destructive behaviors (for example, substance abuse).
- 173 **1 Corinthians 6:19-20** Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you whim you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.
  - E. It forbids hating, despising, or slandering other groups of people (prejudice, racism, and so forth).
- 175 **James 2:1** My brothers, show no partiality as you hold the faith in our Lord Jesus Christ. (pgs. 88-90)
