

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:



By his good conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. ¹⁴But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. ¹⁵This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. ¹⁶For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. ¹⁷But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸And a harvest of righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace.

Warning Against Worldliness

¹What causes quarrels and what causes fights among you? Is it not this, that your passions are at war within you? ²You desire and do not have, so you murder. You covet and cannot obtain, so you fight and quarrel. You do not have, because you do not ask. ³You ask and do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions. ⁴You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God. ⁵Or do you suppose it is to no purpose that the Scripture says, "He yearns jealously over the spirit that he has made to dwell in us"? ⁶But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." ¬Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. ®Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. ®Be wretched and mourn and weep. Let your laughter be turned to mourning and your joy to gloom. ¹OHumble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.

And when he is killed, after three days he will rise." ³²But they did not understand the saying, and were afraid to ask him.

³³And they came to Capernaum. And when he was in the house he asked them, "What were you discussing on the way?" ³⁴But they kept silent, for on the way they had argued with one another about who was the greatest. ³⁵And he sat down and called the twelve. And he said to them, "If anyone would be first, he must be last of all and servant of all." ³⁶And he took a child and put him in the midst of them, and taking him in his arms, he said to them, ³⁷"Whoever receives one such child in my name receives me, and whoever receives me, receives not me but him who sent me."




Prayer of the Church

The proper response is "Hear our prayer."


- P Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.

M Note From The Organist:

Today we have music by two of the giants of the late Baroque Cra. Bach and Telemann were acquainted with each other and often communicated. BWV 730-31 are two brief settings of one of the most popular chorales. The original text, "Dearest Jesus, We are there," was frequently sung as a sermon hymn in Bach's time. "Word of God, Come Down on Carth" is a twentieth century text adapted to the same melody. BWV 730 is a basic version of the chorale with minimal ornamentation. BWV 731 is a highly ornamented setting for two manuals and is one of the most familiar of Bach's Chorale settings.

Telemann was better known than Bach when they were both living. He was known all over Europe while Bach's reputation was largely confined to the provinces of what is now southeast Germany around Leipzig and Presden. Although Telemann was a highly prolific composer, his output for keyboard and organ was relatively limited. Telemann's setting of another traditional Lutheran hymn is for manuals only, with some interesting counterpoint around the plainly stated melody.

Stewardship Bulletin Blurb

Mark 9:32 – "But they did not understand the saying, and were afraid to ask him." The disciples really do hold up a mirror to our faces and force us to see ourselves: misunderstanding, afraid, confused. But the Word of God is clear if only we will listen with open ears. What was blocking the disciples' ears? The Gospels tell us time and again: they did not expect a suffering Christ, and so when Jesus spoke of suffering, they plugged their ears and didn't listen, so they ended up confused and scared. What about us? What's in the Word of God that we find hard to hear and contrary to our desires and expectations? That might just be exactly what we need to hear!

<u>Lectionary Summary for the Eighteenth Sunday After Pentecost</u>

Our Father Cares for His Children with the Gospel of His Son

The sinful heart is filled with "bitter jealousy and selfish ambition" (James 3:14), which causes hostility, quarrels and conflicts, even among those who are fellow members of the Body of Christ. This should not be so! Rather, God "opposes the proud" with His Law, in order to humble them unto repentance; He "gives grace to the humble," in order to exalt them by His Gospel of forgiveness (James 4:6–10). This true "wisdom from above" is found in the gentleness, mercy and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, who humbled Himself and sacrificed Himself for the salvation of sinners (James 3:17). He was "like a gentle lamb led to the slaughter," committing Himself to God, His Father, "who judges righteously, who tests the heart and the mind" (Jer. 11:19–20). Therefore, "after three days," His Father exalted Him by raising Him from the dead (Mark 9:31). In Holy Baptism, He takes disciples of all ages into His arms like little children. In receiving Him through repentance and faith in His forgiveness of sins, they receive from His Father a share in the glory of His cross and resurrection (Mark 9:36–37).

Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

In Mark 9:36-37, Jesus explicitly instructs us to receive children as His own precious treasures. Sometimes this does indeed involve difficulty, but our God enlists both the Prophet Jeremiah (11:20) and the apostle James (4:7) to encourage us in resisting selfish ambition and committing this cause to the Lord. He will sustain the Gospel-motivated voice For Life until it succeeds!

Explanation of Small Catechism: Apostle's Creed

167. How did Jesus rescue me from the devil?

He defeated Satan by obeying His Father's will throughout His earthly life, even going all the way to the cross, all in our place.

- **Philippians 2:8** Being found in human form, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
- Genesis 3:15 I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel.
- **1 John 3:8** The reason the Son of God appeared was to destroy the works of the devil.

Read Matthew 4:1-11, about Jesus' temptation. Other passages also explain our rescue from the devil: Luke 8:26-39; Romans 8:31-34; Philippians 2:6-11; Colossians 2:15; Hebrews 2:14; James 4:7; and 1 Peter 5:8-9. Christ always followed the will of the Father for us, in our place – His active obedience. Christ also suffered, in our place, all the punishment we deserved for our sin – His passive obedience.
