Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:

(I Corinthians 11:27-29)







I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.



who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified,


who spoke by the prophets.

Let us pray for the whole Church of God in Christ Jesus and for all people according to their needs.




- P Grant, O Lord, that Your people may always hold fast to the Word that has been preached to them and not believe it in vain. Lord, in Your mercy,

### M Note From The Organist:

I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say" is an interesting study in hymnology. In The Lutheran Hymnal, the hymn is set to a tune by John Bacchus Pykes, (1823-1876) who wrote many hymn tunes, and still has a number of tunes in LSB. In Lutheran Book of Worship (1978) and Lutheran Worship (1982) it is set to a much older tune by English Composer Thomas Tallis. (1505-85) Some Non-Lutheran hymnals use the tune Kingsfold (LSB 444, 846.)

For LSB, it is set to a new tune by Amanda Husberg (1940-2021) who spent much of her earger at St. John the Evangelist Lutheran Church in Brooklyn. She named the tune Sarah-Clizabeth after her niege. Benjamin Culli has done a beautiful setting of Husberg's tune, featuring a duet between the Great Bourdon (flute) and the Choir Clarinet.

The Lamb" is another new hymn and tune written by Gerald P. Coleman (b. 1953) During a Summer course at Concordia University St. Louis. Coleman has served many Lutheran Churches as musician and minister. Kevin Hildebrand has done an interesting setting of this tune, which utilizes flutes and principals contrasting with the trompette stop. The relatively mild trompette of Good Shepherd's Reuter organ is perfect for this piece, because it's telling without being too powerful.

### **Lectionary Summary for the Sixth Sunday After Epiphany**

### Christians Live by Faith in Christ and Rejoice in the Promise of His Resurrection

"Cursed is the man who trusts in man," for all the strength of his flesh is like the grass that fades away (Jer. 17:5). The one who turns away from the Lord may have food and money and laugh for now, but he "shall mourn and weep" in the judgment (Luke 6:24–25). But "the man who trusts in the Lord" is blessed with all that he needs, "like a tree planted by water." When heat comes, he survives (Jer. 17:7–8). For the Lord has come in the flesh to heal the people of all their diseases, to cleanse their spirits with forgiveness, and to preach the Gospel of the kingdom of God to the poor (Luke 6:18–20). As all of this is by way of His cross, it is solely by faith in the promise of His resurrection that Christians "rejoice" and "leap for joy" (Luke 6:21–23). "If Christ has not been raised," our faith is in vain and we are most to be pitied (1 Cor. 15:14–19). But, in fact, just as "Christ died for our sins," so has He also "been raised from the dead" (1 Cor. 15:3, 20).

### **Stewardship Bulletin Blurb**

Luke 6:20–21 – "Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God. Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you shall be satisfied." The Beatitudes are largely about emptiness: if you're poor, your pockets are empty. If you are hungry, your stomach is empty. If you are mourning, there's an emptiness in your heart that used to be filled with the presence of a loved one. Jesus assures us in each case that the Lord will fill our emptiness. That assurance gives us not only peace, but also courage to follow the Lord faithfully.

### **Weekly Memory Verse Challenge**

God is not man, that he should lie, or a son of man, that he should change his mind. Has he said, and will he not do it? Or has he spoken, and will he not fulfill it? **Numbers 23:19** 

### **Lutheran's For Life Thoughts**

Only in 1 Corinthians 15:8 ("untimely born") do the Scriptures use a technical term for "abortion." Paul labeled himself like a miscarriage or one designated for intentional termination. But the Lord God intervened by reaching out with the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Savior dying and rising makes abortion entirely unnecessary – and diametrically opposite to the Gospel message and community.
