

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:

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M Note From The Organist:

Today we have music by two composers Anglican tradition, knew each other one often corresponded between themselves. Born in England, Healey Willan moved to Canada in 1910, and in 1921, became music director of the Anglo-Catholic Parish of St. Mary Magdalene in Toronto, where he remained for the rest of his life. His beautiful prelude on "St. Columba" was apparently a favorite of longtime Good Shepherd Organist Milton Eggars. According to the notes his score (which he left to the church) he played it no less than fifteen times between 1966 and 1985.

Vaughan Williams, on the other hand, played for several churches when he was young, but didn't continue this work as he became better known as a symphonic composer. However, he continued to write choral music throughout his life, although his output for organ was small. The Prelude on "Hyfrydol" is the third of his Three Preludes on Welsh Hymn Tunes, and features moving counterpoint under the melody in the soprano voice.

Lectionary Summary for the Seventh Sunday After Epiphany

As the Son of God Is Merciful and Forgives Your Sins, You Also Be Merciful and Forgive Your inheritance as a child of Adam is sin and death, but in Christ you are made alive through His resurrection from the dead (1 Cor. 15:21–22). As you have died with Him in Holy Baptism, so are you raised with Him to newness of life. Therefore, "do not go on sinning" (1 Cor. 15:34). Instead of serving your desires and harming your neighbors, live as "sons of the Most High," and "be merciful, even as your Father is merciful" (Luke 6:35–36). Deal with others as you would have others deal with you (Luke 6:31, 37–38). As Christ loved you when you were at enmity with Him, as He blessed and prayed for those who abused Him, and as He did good to those who hated Him and hurt Him, so also "love your enemies, do good" (Luke 6:27–29, 35). For God sent His Son to bear the cross and suffer death, not to condemn the guilty, but "to preserve life." So does He provide a place for you within His Church, where He is near and deals kindly with "you and your children and your children" (Gen. 45:5–10).

Stewardship Bulletin Blurbs

Luke 6:30–31 – "Give to everyone who begs from you, and from one who takes away your goods do not demand them back. And as you wish that others would do to you, do so to them." Is it really possible to live like this? Would it really work to be so open-handed and generous? Our conscience often reminds us of our failures, and the Lord knows our frailty, that's for sure! But a life of faith is a life lived in imitation of Jesus — and every follower of Jesus knows that yes, indeed, it is better to give than to receive.

Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

Joseph's brothers aborted him well after his birth because they thought him a threat. History eventually disclosed the Heavenly Father's design: a life-giving mission they didn't see (Genesis 45:7-8). The same holds true in the surprise pregnancies and terminal diagnoses we encounter. So Christians practice servanthood to apparently burdensome persons (Luke 6:29), because like mercy from God makes our lives possible.
