Acknowledgments

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A Note From The Organist:

Today we have music by two very different, but equally important contributors to Lutheran music in the 20th century. Paul Manz was a master improviser, and basically invented the Hymn Festival, which has done much to promote congregational singing. His setting of “Jesus, Lead Thou On” features the quiet voices of the organ, including flutes, chromone, and the voix céleste.

Born in The Netherlands, Jan Bender moved to Germany at 13 and studied with a number of the prominent organists of the time. He was drafted into the German Army, where he lost an eye in combat. At the end of the war, he surrendered to American forces and completed his first published composition in a POW camp. He returned to Germany, but soon attracted the attention of Concordia Publishing House, and eventually taught at several Lutheran Universities in America. His setting of “A Mighty Fortress” is a free fantasia for the full organ, featuring his characteristic dissonant harmonic style.

Lectionary Summary for the First Sunday in Lent

Jesus Christ Is Our Champion Against the Devil

Jesus Christ, our champion against the devil, endures and overcomes “every temptation” (Luke 4:13) on our behalf. He worships the Lord, His God, and serves Him only by trusting the Word of His Father: “*You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased*” (Luke 3:22). Jesus’ victory is now ours through His gracious Word, which is not far away but near us – in our mouth and in our heart, in the proclamation of repentance and faith. For “*with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth one confesses and is saved*” (Rom. 10:10). Our confession of Christ includes the prayer of faith, which is not disappointed, “*for ‘everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved’*” (Rom. 10:13). The Lord is not oblivious to “*our affliction, our toil, and our oppression*” (Deut. 26:7), but has mercy upon us. He has brought us out of bondage through the “*signs and wonders*” of Holy Baptism, “*with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm*” (Deut. 26:8), and now He leads us by His Spirit even in the wilderness.

Stewardship Bulletin Blurp

Luke 4:8 – “And Jesus answered him, ‘It is written ...’ Isn’t it interesting that Jesus does not defeat Satan with His power as God, but rather by His perfect obedience in His perfect humanity? Jesus defeats Satan not by miracles, but by quoting the Scriptures and living according to it. This should cause us great joy for two reasons. First, because we see Jesus win the victory for us. Second, because here Jesus shows us how to stand in that victory: on the Word of God alone. Let us build our lives on the sure rock of this Word!
