

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:







who spoke by the prophets.




#### C hear our prayer.


As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.



 For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.





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## A Note From The Organist:

Tom Mueller is a professor at Concordia University, Irvine and a frequent recitalist and clinician around SoCal. "Soul, Adorn Yourself with Gladness" is one of the oldest Communion hymns, with settings by many Composers, including Bach and Brahms. In his setting, Tom Mueller calls for a blended combination of Foundation stops, giving the piece a mellow feel.

Froberger spent much of his life in Vienna, but traveled extensively throughout Europe, gaining exposure to many musical styles and meeting many of the prominent composers of the time. The was among the best-known musicians of his era. This organ music is heavily influenced by Frescobaldi, who was one of his teachers. The Toccata in  $\mathcal{P}$  minor is typical of his style.

## Lectionary Summary for the Fourth Sunday

#### Jesus Christ Has Reconciled Us to the Father

God the Father has opened His heart to us in love. While we were "still a long way off," He saw us and "felt compassion" (Luke 15:20). Therefore, He gave His only begotten Son for us, making "him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Cor. 5:21). By the ministry of reconciliation, He runs to us, embraces us in mercy and clothes us with His glory as beloved sons in Christ Jesus. And so we give thanks unto the Lord our God, who has taken away our sins and turned His anger from us (Is. 12:1). Because He has become our salvation, our strength and our song, we "will trust, and will not be afraid" (Is. 12:2).

#### **Stewardship Bulletin Blurb**

Luke 15:12 – "And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.' And he divided his property between them." This prodigal son only sees the father as a source of wealth. "Give me my inheritance now!" he says, which is really to say, "You are better off dead in my eyes." This is the sin at the heart of all greed: valuing things over people. This parable calls us to come to our senses as well, and to see God as the loving Giver of all good, the true Father to be valued above and beyond all the things of this world.

## Lutheran's For Life Thoughts

The prodigal's father kept watching every day for his wayward son's return. He had to have in order to spot him "while he was still a long way off" (Luke 15:20). Our Gracious God never gives up on a human life, no matter what size, skills, circumstances, or sins it involves. We need not let surprise pregnancies, chronic conditions, or terminal diagnoses steal our hope—or anyone else's!

## Memory Verse Challenge

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit. **1 Peter 3:18** 

## Lutheran Hour Ministry Lenten Devotion BALANCED

TEXT: The high priest then questioned Jesus about His disciples and His teaching. Jesus answered him, "I have spoken openly to the world. I have always taught in synagogues and in the temple, where all Jews come together. I have said nothing in secret. Why do you ask Me? Ask those who have heard Me what I said to them; they know what I said." When He had said these things, one of the officers standing by struck Jesus with his hand, saying, "Is that how You answer the high priest?" Jesus answered him, "If what I said is wrong, bear witness about the wrong; but if what I said is right, why do you strike Me?" (John 18:19-23)

It amazes me how balanced Jesus' responses are in court. The high priest is openly breaking the law by questioning the prisoner rather than calling witnesses. Jesus knows this is illegal, and He calls him on it. He does the same with the officer who hits Him. Jesus doesn't start throwing lightning bolts. Nor does He say nothing at all and allow both people to wade deeper and deeper into sin without warning. He says just what needs saying and then stops.

This comforts me because it tells me that Jesus will treat me the same way, too. When He needs to warn me against sin, He will. He won't overdo it and terrify me, but He won't ignore my situation, either. And when He truly needs to pull out all the stops and do everything in His power to save me, He'll do that. Because that's what He did for all of us, when He suffered, died, and rose again— to save us from evil and give us life.

WE PRAY: Lord, let me listen to You with all my heart. Amen.
