

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, and welcome to The Good Shepherd Lutheran Church!


To Those Intending To Commune This Morning:

who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets.



hear our prayer.







The Words of Our Lord

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is My + body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me."

In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My + blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

Proclamation of Christ

- As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until He comes.

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A Note From The Organist:

Two settings by Bach of the most popular Palm Sunday hymn. Although the text dates from the 9th Century and the melody from the 17th century, Bach would not have known this text. The would have known the tune as "Farewell I Gladly bid Thee," a hymn celebrating uniting with Jesus. The hymn as we know it appeared in the 19th century, translated and arranged by John Mason Neale (1818-66). Nevertheless, Bach's settings could easily reflect the text of LSB 442. Schweitzer considers BWV 735 more meditative in nature, but it would not be difficult to interchange the two settings with some adjustments in registration and tempo.

<u>Lectionary Summary for Palm Sunday</u> The Cross and Passion of Our Lord Are the Hour of His Glory

The King of Israel comes into His royal glory by the path of humble obedience "to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Phil. 2:8). He "goes as it has been determined" (Luke 22:22), according to the Scriptures, willingly submitting to His Father's plan for the salvation of sinners. "Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name" (Phil. 2:9). His suffering and death open the way of repentance for the forgiveness of sins because He goes to the cross bearing the sins of the world. In His resurrection, God the Father vindicates His people and has compassion on His servants (Deut. 32:36). He kills to make alive; He wounds in order to heal. In remembrance of Him, we praise God, confessing "that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Phil. 2:11).

Stewardship Bulletin Blurb

Luke 22:11 – "Tell the master of the house, 'The Teacher says to you, Where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?' " Did Jesus really *need* this man's Upper Room? If the man had refused to let Jesus use it, would the work of salvation have been derailed? Of course not. But what an honor for the man who owned this room! It is the same with us. The Lord needs none of us, but what an honor it is for God to choose to use our generosity in the work of His church.
